But late in the fight the Germans lost their accuracy.

Eye fatigue and poor visibility

When all the tests were averaged, the eyes of 80 per cent were definitely affected by emotion. A single individual, although he might show improvement in one eye function, often became worse in another.

These discoveries pointed to the need not only of advance examination of emotional effects on persons engaged in work requiring visual efficiency during emotional strain. They showed that even the person whose eyes do excellent work, may break down in the specific job if it happens to be the one which does not fit his reactions to emotion.

But how much accuracy of gunfire can be increased by the eye studies is guesswork.
