British, Greeks Repulse German Attacks; Ptolemais and Kozane Occupied by Nazis

Tanks and Planes Seen as Superior To Europe's Best

Patterson Gives Opinion to Senate Committee; Stimson Testifies United States Facing 'Dangerous Emergency' at Present

Washington, April 15.—(AP)—Undersecretary of War Robert P. Patterson, told senators today that the Army's light and medium tanks were "superior in speed, armor and weapons to those of any other Army" and its bombing and pursuit planes better than Europe's best. Patterson testified before the Senate Defense Investigating Committee after Secretary of War Stimson had told the same group that the United States was facing "a dangerous emergency" which "may be very prolonged."

In preparation to meet this emergency, Stimson indicated, civilian needs may be subordinated to the military program.

Knox Speaks Gravely
Before the House Naval Committee, Secretary of the Navy Knox likewise spoke gravely, saying:

"We are now in the midst of the decisive period of this World war and step by step we are gradually but steadily being encircled, isolated, and should disaster come to those who are actually engaged in this war, I see this nation surrounded by nations who have made known how they feel about our nation and our institutions."

In a lengthy explanation of the defense procurement program, Patterson asserted charges that the War Department had favored large concerns in letting contracts were "unfounded."

At for geographical factors in letting contracts, Patterson remarked:

"We had to take industrial America as we found it. For steel, we went to the established steel mills. For automobiles, we went to Detroit. So does the general public."

Washington, April 15.—(AP)—Citing comparatively low figures for Great Britain, Canada and Australia, Senator Vandenberg (R-Mich.) told the Senate today that true time the American people faced the "grim reality" that heavily increased taxation was in order.

Vandenberg placed in the record a letter from the Treasury, showing that Great Britain was raising about 60 per cent of its present expenditures by taxation, Australia about 50 per cent and Canada, about 30 per cent. The United States, Vandenberg said, was raising only about 20 per cent.

Nazi Warships Again Target Of Bombers

London, April 15.—(AP)—British warplanes dropped heavy bombs "either on or near" the 26,000-ton German battleships Goebenau and Scharnhorst in another attack last night on the German Naval base at Brest, the Air Ministry announced today.

Hundreds of bombs were unloaded over the dock area of the port, in a communiqué declared in a 4-hour assault.

Hungar Action Linked to Axis

Budapest, Hungary, April 15.—(AP)—The official Hungarian news agency declared today that Hungary took military action against Yugoslavia because the new Yugoslav government broke away from political cooperation with Germany and Italy.

The authorized statement added that Moscow's criticism of the action indicated Soviet Russia apparently was not aware of all the facts.

The statement flatly linked the Hungarian action in sending forces into northeastern Yugoslavia with its program of Axis cooperation.

Soviet Criticism Published
At the same time, the Soviet statement last week criticizing the action was published in Hungary for the first time.

(Andriy Y. Vishinsky, Soviet vice commissar of foreign affairs, told Hungarian Minister Joseph Kristofy, "A particularly bad impression is produced upon the Soviet government by the fact that Hungary commenced war against Yugoslavia but four months after she concluded with the latter a pact of eternal friendship. It is not difficult to realize what would be the position of Hungary should she herself get into trouble and be torn to bits since it is known that there are national minorities in Hungary too.")

The official news agency carried this text of the Hungarian statement. The declaration by Moscow was published in the Pravda.

Advance into Greece On Left of Old Line; Cross Aliakmon River

30 British Armored Cars Are Destroyed; Continue Pursuit and Encirclement of Remnants of Serb Army in Yugoslavia; Localized Resistance in Mostar-Sarajevo Region.

Berlin, April 15.—(AP)—German troops driving into northern Greece have repulsed British forces and occupied Ptolemais and Kozane, the latter 40 miles south of the Albanian and Yugoslav border junction, the German high command announced today. The German communiqué said units of the German Army and Blackshirt Elite (SS) corps also had forced a crossing of the Aliakmon river north of Verria, a rail town 30 miles northeast of Kozane and about an equal distance north of Mount Olympus. Near Ptolemais, 30 British armored cars were reported destroyed.

In Yugoslavia, the high command asserted German and Italian troops were continuing their pursuit and encirclement of remnants of the Serb army, which was declared showing localized resistance in the Mostar-Sarajevo region.

Numerous additional prisoners were brought in, including the commanding general of the southern Yugoslav army, the war bulletin added.

Hungarian troops were reported to have completed occupation of the Drava-Danube river triangle in northern Yugoslavia and had reached Donyu in the east and occupied Novy.

The high command asserted that Nazi units were pursuing retreating British south of Salonika and that the British rear guard at Tobruk, Libya, hemmed in by German and Italian units which had reached the Egyptian outpost of Salmu, there no longer was any attempt here to minimize the seriousness of the situation.

Although public confidence in Gen. Sir Archibald P. Wavell, British Middle East commander, appeared strong, most observers agreed that he is facing a more difficult task than he one he accomplished only a few months ago when he drove the Italians out of Egypt.

Fleet Facing Threat
This time, they pointed out, the British fleet—which played a big part in blasting the Italians from positions along the North African coast—will be facing the threat of hampering attacks from Nazi bombers.

From this distance, the British positions around Matruh, which were held since Nov. 22, were reported to be in a state of readiness.

Less Gloom Over Claims Axis Makes

Situation in Mediterranean Serious, But Not Grave; Several Staff Factories Aspects Seen.

London, April 15.—(AP)—There were signs today of a resurgence of British optimism despite alarming claims from the Axis camp and Britain's own military reports on the situation in Greece and Africa.

Informed British sources said a Rome report that Yugoslavia was a typical bit of Goebbels propaganda. SS added that "the latest information received here gives no reason for any despondency about the military and diplomatic situation."

The report, these sources said, was "probably put out to create alarm and despondency" among the Allies.

Deated as "Fascistic"
In authoritative military circles the German and Italian reports that vessels were lying off Piraeus, port of Athens, to remove the Axis from the city, were said to be driving toward Kozane and Siatista, Greek towns 30 miles south of Ptolemais.

4 Killed, 20 Wounded In Soft Coal Fields

Shooting at Mine Which Has Not Stopped Operations in General Shut-Down Due to Wage Dispute.

Gunfire in the southeast Kentucky soft coal fields killed four men this morning and resulted in wounding of more than 20 others. Officers said they could not determine at once what led to the shooting near a mine which has not stopped operations in a general shut-down due to a wage dispute.

Patrolman Guy Harrell of Middleboro, Ky., said the battle started on a road leading to The Fork Ridge Coal Company mine, about a mile from the Tennessee line. He said motorcades of miners have assembled there last night and headed toward the mine, which has operated throughout the shut-down of operations in adjoining Harlan county since the union operator contract expired April 1.

Company Head Victim
The dead included C. W. Rhodes, 45, president of The Fork Ridge Coal Company and an American Association member, a combination of soft coal mining interests which founded Middleboro. E. W. Silvers, vice president and treasurer of the coal company; a miner and a former Tennessee highway patrolman.

British Report No Contact in Vicinity of Mount Olympus as Greeks Battle Foes Near Ptolemais; German Drive Toward Kozane and Siatista, South of Phobrina.

Athens, Greece, April 15.—(AP)—Repeated German attacks on the British-held right flank of the newly reformed Allied line in northern Greece have been repulsed, but the Nazis are advancing into the Hellenic kingdom on the left after occupying Ptolemais, which had been the northernmost hinge of the old defense line, the British and Greeks disclosed today. The British said that elsewhere in their sector of the line, in the vicinity of Mount Olympus, there was no contact with the enemy."

Axis Leaders Laud Croatia

Hitler and Mussolini Extend Recognition to New Balkan State.

Berlin, April 15.—(AP)—Adolf Hitler formally recognized the new independent state of Croatia today in a telegram to Ante Pavelic, veteran Croat leader.

It was announced that Croat and Axis representatives would meet to discuss mutual problems, including the designation of boundaries.

The Fuehrer's message, authorized sources said, was sent in answer to messages from Pavelic and Gen. Blasko Kvaternik advising Germany of the Croatian proclamation of independence and asking her recognition.

Pavelic has been described in dispatches from Budapest as president of the new state and Kvaternik as its premier.

Text of Telegram
The telegram said: "I thank you and General Kvaternik for the telegram in which you advised me of the proclamation of independence of the Croatian state in accordance with the desires of the Croatian people and asked for recognition by the Reich of the new state. I am glad to inform you that the Reich has recognized the independence of the Croatian state."

London radio reports purporting to give Greek news of victories such as repulsion of the SS and Adolf Hitler Guards were declared to be "fantastic and silly lies."
