When the gardens begin to produce, each tenant is taught to can his surplus output. The co-operative would be cared that but for malanes and employs a home management supervisor.

Each family, the supervisor's report shows, canned an average of 35b quarts of food during the past years. The average before that, she said, was 35 quarts, monthy pickles, for each family.
