

British, Greeks Withdraw to New Line; German Mechanized Forces Push South

Defense Activity Leaves No Room For Complacency

Jones Couples Report of Progress with Two Warnings; Might Become Isolated Economically Which Would Lead to Warfare.

New York, April 21.—(AP)—Secretary of Commerce Jesse H. Jones declared today that although defense activity is "better than good," there is no room for American "complacency." "There is no place for indifference," Jones said in a speech prepared for delivery at the annual luncheon of the Associated Press at the Hotel Waldorf-Astoria. The secretary coupled a report of progress in defense over the past year with two warnings:

"If the aggressor nations are successful, our generation is apt to see little of tranquility. If we are to get ready to defend ourselves, let's be sure that we do a good job of it."

Not Easy to Army Dwelling momentarily on "our lack of preparedness" a year ago, he conceded it is "not easy for a peace-loving people like ours to change overnight from purely peacetime pursuits to complete all-out effort at armaments, even for defense."

"This is particularly true," he said, "because we have always had faith in the protection of the oceans, and have always believed that no power could invade us. May be we can't be invaded, but we might become isolated economically, and that would inevitably lead to war. These outlets are the cause of great wars."

"Fortunately," he said at another point, "most publishers and editors of American newspapers can be depended upon for a high order of integrity and patriotism. Fortunately, in America the people have the services of such agencies."

Cairo, Egypt, April 21.—(AP)—At least 16 German aircraft were shot down in Greece yesterday, the biggest total in one day since the German Army began its offensive, the R. A. F. Middle East command announced today.

Fourteen of the Nazi planes were destroyed in one big air battle over Athens in which a "very large formation" of German aircraft was engaged, the British said.

Seven of the German planes shot down over Athens were listed as JU-88 dive bombers. The other seven were British planes lost.
