Would Deprive Half of Benefits

Jacksonville, Fla., April 23—(F)
—Exemption of daily newspapers of less than 5,000 circulation from the wage and hour law would deprive workers of more than half of the nation's newspaper workers of the legislation's benefits, Harold Jacobs, assistant administratio, of the Federal Wage and Hour Division, said today.

Jacobs, in an address prepared for delivery at the convention of The National Editorial Association, said such an exemption proposed by Senator Wiley (R-Wis) was "narrow in scope."

"Judging from the Ayer's Anoual, the Wiley amendment would deprive all benefits of the law from employes in 8,453 newspapers, or 60.5 per cent of the total aumber in the United States," he sectared.
