

Nazis Claim Thermopylae Pass Taken; Six-Inch Guns Used Against Defenders

Possibility Forces From Axis Partly Occupy Greenland

Disclosed by Roosevelt in What He Frankly Calls Surprising Statement; Neutrality Patrol to Operate as Far As Needed for Defense

Washington, April 25.—(AP)—A possibility that Axis forces partly occupy Greenland, big Danish island in the western hemisphere now under American protection, was disclosed by President Roosevelt today in what he frankly termed a surprising statement.

But emphatically the president said that the administration was not thinking of convoys at this time. He described the task of American patrol ships as the reconnaissance of ocean areas to determine whether an aggressor ship might be coming into the western hemisphere.

Neutrality Patrol Not Convoys. Convoys, on the other hand, Mr. Roosevelt said, were escorting merchant ships in a group to prevent acts of aggression on the high seas.

The president also told reporters that Americans who have taken the attitude that the dictators will be victorious had adopted a dumb attitude which was not good Americanism.

Declaring that he was "agin" dictators and that everybody was, Mr. Roosevelt said that America was willing to fight for democratic processes.

Roosevelt Places Lindbergh in Category of Civil War Appeasers, Whose Head Banished

Washington, April 25.—(AP)—President Roosevelt placed Col. Charles A. Lindbergh today in the category of Civil War "copperheads."

The president was asked at a press conference why the Army had not taken up Lindbergh's commission. The famous aviator, who frequently has criticized the administration's foreign policy, is a reserve colonel.

The president remarked that in the Civil War, both the Confederates and the Northerners took on liberty-loving people from other countries, and both let certain people go.

Way to Raise Taxes Needed Not Settled

Disension Crops Up on Specific Methods of Obtaining Vast Revenue Treasury Asks

Washington, April 25.—(AP)—The House Ways and Means Committee said today congressional tax experts had suggested levy of excise taxes on several foods, the use of automobiles and airplanes and insurance premiums in connection with plans to raise \$2,500,000,000 in new revenue.

These and other levies, proposed by the staff of the joint Congressional Committee on taxation, would be in addition to a long list of excise taxes proposed by the Treasury Department which would yield an estimated \$601,000,000.

Darlan Fails To See Nazi

Leaves Paris for Vichy Even Without Conference With Pierre Laval

Vichy, France, April 25.—(AP)—Vice-Admiral Jean Darlan left Paris for Vichy today without meeting the German ambassador, Pierre Laval, chief French exponent of collaboration with Germany.

Otto Abetz, the Nazi envoy, was out of the city and not expected to return until next week when Darlan may make a new trip to the German-occupied capital.

Darlan was to preside this evening without conference with the German ambassador and was expected to report on interviews at Paris and Bayreuth where, respectively, he is said to have met the French ambassador at Paris, Fernand de Brinon, and Adolf Hitler's deputy, Rudolf Hess.

Aver British Thrown Out Inside 48 Hours; Beat Back Infantry

British and Greeks Cling Doggedly to Positions In Face of Massed German Forces; Latest Reports Dramatic But Barren of Detail; Report Nazis Losses Are Heavy

Athens, April 25.—(AP)—Six-inch guns, the heaviest artillery the Nazis have used in their drive toward Athens, have been fired from the British and Greek defenders of Thermopylae, where grey-green waves of German infantry were beaten back.

The British announced from Cairo that a further "orderly" withdrawal of their forces had been executed after the infliction of severe casualties on the attacking Germans.

Dramatic but barren of detail, latest reports from the British and Greek clung doggedly to their positions in the face of massed German forces.

Indicates Fierce Resistance. Observers here regarded the news that the Nazis, after trying infantry assault, had brought big guns up through the mountains to storm the defenses, as "extremely light."

One hundred miles southeast of the mountainous battlefront, German air power continued to concentrate on ports and shipping near Athens, itself shaken at dawn last night by a thunderous dive-bomber attack on the port of Piraeus, five miles away.

A Greek communique early today said the Germans had smashed land points at Eleusis, Megara, and elsewhere in the Attica region.

Fighting Makes 'Extraordinary Demands' on Germans Who Make Forced March of 50 Miles; Machine Gun Nests Pour Poisoning Fire into Nazi Attackers; Capture Artillery

Berlin, April 25.—(AP)—The German high command today announced that Nazi troops had thrown the British out of Thermopylae pass. Belated reports from Thermopylae said that the well-fortified position of empire forces was taken in less than 48 hours although the fighting made "extraordinary demands" on the Germans who had made a 50-mile forced march.

Machine-gun nests poured a poisoning fire into the Nazi attackers, it was said.

"To Greece Thermopylae pass was taken in an embracing attack, and the enemy was thrown out of a strongly fortified position," said the daily communique in announcing the piercing of the historic mountains less than 100 miles north of Athens, where the British contingent had held up the Nazi advance.

Mountain Troops Landed. "Mountain troops again had an outstanding share in this success," said the communique.

(A non-committal communique of the high command yesterday, together with today's report, indicated the Germans had been held up more than 48 hours in their efforts to take the strategic pass.)

Informed sources said many pieces of heavy artillery and war machinery fell into their hands in the pass.

At the same time black-embellished loads of bombs and Stukas were reported making relentless attacks against ship concentrations and airports in an effort to (Continued On Page Two)
