235 Patients Die in Raids

195 Injured in Attacks On Hospitals Prior to April 17.

London, April 30.—(AP)—Health Minister Ernest Brown announced today 235 hospital patients had been killed and 195 injured in raids in the Greater London area during the week ending April 17.

The figures which covered 400 hospitals of all kinds in London, were issued, Brown said, to dispel public fears concerning risks incurred by hospital patients during air attacks.

Of these 1300 casualties receiving wards included in London's emergency scheme, only three had been put out of action completely, Brown declared.

The number of total fatalities in the whole country up to the end of March were almost 20,000 and the number of injured about 40,000.

Only Three Doctors Killed

Only three doctors were killed and eight injured as a result of bomb damage to London hospitals, while 6,000 nurses, 40 have been killed and 154 injured, he added.

Fifteen hospital porters or attendants were reported killed and 76 injured.

Brown said, much the same situation in regard to hospital casualties existed elsewhere in England. In one area, where two ports have been repeatedly bombed, six hospitals have been hit, but only one is still out of commission, he said.

Explaining the reason for his announcement, Brown told a press conference.

"We have all heard a great deal about the bombing of hospitals, but only in London but also in provincial cities. Hospitals run no more risk than other buildings."

"During intensive and indiscriminate attacks of the past eight months many have in fact been damaged, but in the main this damage has been slight."
