House Adopts Bill To Let Banks Be Insurance Agent

Measure Authorizing Sale of Small Policies Passed After Sharp Debate; Democrat Leader Charges 'Sabotage' Of Pending Statute.

State Capitol, Hartford, May 1.—(P)—The House adopted today a measure authorizing banks to act as agents for insurance companies in the sale of small policies after a sharp debate in which Democratic Floor Leader T. Emmet Clark charged that it was introduced to "sabotage" the pending savings bank life insurance bill. The bill was adopted by a voice vote, with the opposition concentrated among the Democratic minority. It now goes to the Senate, controlled by Democrats.
