

S. stamp above pictures the flimsy plane in which the Wright brothers made the first heavier-than-air flight in 1903. Other U. S. issues show airplanes of 1918 and 1940

show airplanes of 1918 and 1940 clipper ships.

Mythology relates the story of Icarus, and his flight too close to the sun. Bellepheron and the winged horse, Pegasus, are also shown on stamps.


