





Bitter Feud Seen As Speech Result

Tokyo, May 6—(P)—The Japan Times Advertiser declared yesterday in a front-page editorial that "Americans who have put Lindbergh to the fore as a spokesman against aid for Britain are likely to arouse a bitter feud throughout the states which can seriously undermine the drive" to help England.

"Lindbergh's attacks," the newspaper asserted, "can be regarded by Roosevelt as treasonable. Already he has caused Lindbergh to resign as a reserve officer...."

The editorial, headed "American Disunity Undermines Democracies and Strengthens Axis Cause." said in discussing Lindbergh's St. Louis speech that it "takes on the character of a direct challenge to the Roosevelt policies."
