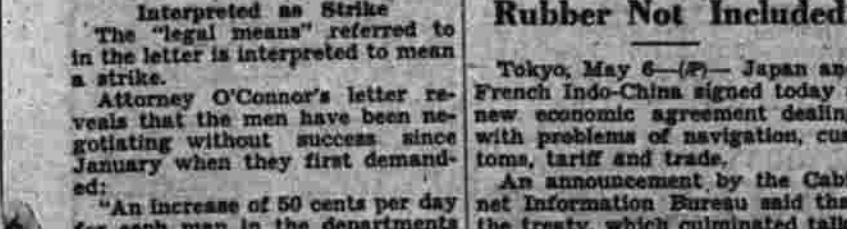

Board Again Denies Plea

'Lefty' McDonnell, Connected with Madden Murder, Asked Pardon

The petition of Michael (Lefty) McDonnell, now 62, who was sentenced to life imprisonment at Wethersfield on April 5, 1919, in connection with the murder of Captain William F. Madden, has again been denied. He was one of five men given life sentences. Of these, one died in prison, two were pardoned and two are still behind bars. William Beaser and McDonnell, McDonnell told the board that the man who actually fired the shot had been pardoned four years ago. He was referring to John Neuss as Miller was pardoned some time before and is now dead. At the trial both Neuss and Miller testified for the state, telling of the plans for the robbery but did not name the person who had done the shooting. Miller and Neuss were both railroad men and traced the movement of cars loaded with raw silk that were shipped into Manchester.
