

State Labor Bill Tabled by House; Door Now Closed

Hadden Tells Representatives 'Insurmountable Wave of Opposition' Has Developed; CIO Members Picketed Corridors of Capitol.

State Capitol, Hartford, May 14.—(P) The Republican-controlled House tabled today the state labor relations bill after Majority Leader William L. Hadden told the representatives that an "insurmountable wave of opposition" had developed against it. The House action, which closed the doors to any such legislation this year, came while CIO members picketed the Capitol corridors in protest against both the bill and the decision of Republican representatives to block debate on the issue by the motion to table.

Hadden told the House that in moving to table the measure, approved unanimously some time ago by the Senate, he was complying with the wishes expressed by the Republican members at a caucus yesterday.

Believed Measure Good

One of the principal supporters of the measure, the Republicans, said that he had always felt and believed now that the measure was a "good act which simply protects" both labor and industry.

He asserted that since the bill came out of committee, however, it had been subjected to "unwarranted and mistaken" criticism. Some of its critics, contended Hadden, "showed a complete failure to grasp the purpose of a collective bargaining act."

The House tabled the bill by a voice vote, with the Democrats on the side voting almost solidly against the motion.

While the motion itself was not debated, several representatives arose later "to explain" their votes. Discussion of the measure, continued for almost a half hour by the Parliamentarian, ended when the debate closure rule on talking motion was ended when Rep. John H. Thorough (D-Stratford) moved "that the post mortem be closed."

Hess' Writings Will Make Nazis Sweat; Took No Documents

Germans Assert Hess Flew to Glasgow Region to Make Contact With Duke of Hamilton, Described as Member of Pacifist Organization; Assert He Is Politically Incompetent

Berlin, May 14.—(P) Nazis declared tonight that Rudolf Hess carried no documents to Britain likely to reveal German state and military secrets and that he flew to the Glasgow area to make contact with the Duke of Hamilton, described as a member of a pacifist organization.

They asserted that Hess was politically incompetent and that any peace proposals he might make in Britain would be disavowed by Berlin.
