Advises Home Buyers To Avoid Inflated Valuations and Second Mortgages

Families who are going to buy homes should not be misled or persuaded by spurious arguments into buying homes on an unsound basis. The FHA provides a safe financing method for both borrowers and lenders. There can be no sound sustained home-building program for families of modest incomes except upon the basis of long-term mortgage loans payable in regular installments, combined with conservative valuations. Home buyers should beware of using any other financing method unless they purposely choose to do so after careful study of the sound facilities available under the FHA program.
