## Committees Urge \$62,050,000 State Operating Budget

Amount Set by Appropriations Group Is \$1,224,000 Higher Than Total Recommended By Hurley Early in Session of Legislature.

Hartford, May 17.—(AP)—The Legislative Appropriations Committee will recommend a state operating budget of \$62,050,000 for the next two years to the General Assembly next week. The committee's budget for the biennium beginning next July 1 and ending June 30, 1943, is \$1,224,000 higher than the \$60,826,000 budget recommended by Governor Hurley early in the legislative session.

The appropriations recommended in the budget bill, which will probably be reported on Tuesday, plus sums previously recommended by the committee of the House and Senate and items recommended by the governor which the committee has not yet taken action on, total \$64,780,000.

The state's general fund income during the next two years has been estimated at \$64,440,000.

One of the largest recommended increases in budgetary items will be an increased expenditure of \$3,100,000 for the program of aid to dependent children. The actual increase to the state, however, will be \$450,000 since the Federal government will grant \$2,650,000 for the work.

The budget will include a \$90,000 cut in the Personnel Department's appropriation, elimination of funds for a new cafeteria in the State Capitol, and the recommendation that a proposed \$227,000 statewide juvenile-court-protection system be abandoned. The committee will recommend only continuation of a \$181,000 appropriation for the present juvenile court in Windham and Fairfield counties.

The committee will have before them proposals for \$1,000,000 in capital outlay, including the \$750,000 recommended by the governor. Among his recommendations were \$200,000 for a new state armory at New London, \$250,000 for a dormitory at the Newfield prison farm, \$75,000 for stores at the Norwich State hospital, and \$85,000 for cottages and a swimming pool at the Meriden State school for boys.

The committee will approve the governor's executive proposal of \$365,000 for state employees in the first year of the biennium, but will recommend striking from the budget \$380,000 for additional raises in the second year.

They will, however, exceed the governor's recommendation by \$400,000 in stipulating a sum of \$100,000 for the newly-created State Defense Council, and its recommendation for \$240,000 for separation allowances to be paid dependents of men in military service.

## Britain's Fliers Hold Edge in Middle East; Ponder Colonies Rule

21 American Republics Prepare to Establish 'Provisional Administration' Over Possessions in Western Hemisphere If Forecast of Close Collaboration of Nazis, French Grows.

Washington, May 17.—(AP)—The 21 American republics today prepared to establish "provisional administration" over French colonies in the Americas, it was learned authoritatively, if the forecast close "collaboration" between Germany and France should be projected into the western hemisphere. Any decisive action, however, will be delayed, it was said, pending clarification of the degree of the Vichy government's cooperation in setting up the Nazi "new order" in Europe.

The United States and the other American nations are fully aware of the dangerous implications of a Nazi foothold on this side of the Atlantic, authoritative sources declared, and complete plans have been prepared to act whenever the danger of such a move and security of the American continent.

Washington, May 17.—(AP)—A huge fleet of submarines which once fought at Britain's side might be used against her in the life-or-death battle of the Atlantic if London obtains the collaboration of France to the extent of taking over or winning domination of the French Navy.

The submarines are the most numerous of all the vessels at the disposal of the Vichy government. Secretary Knox told Congress earlier this year that the French had 60 of the undersea craft, 52 destroyers, 14 cruisers, one aircraft carrier and 20 battleships.

FOUR million Britons were on guard for an invasion. When it came a single Scottish farmer named David McLean, armed with a pitchfork, captured the invader.

It was a one-man invasion, but the British would not have exulted more if they had surrounded a half-dozen of Adolf Hitler's prize divisions. Britain said the one man was Rudolf Hess.

**The Man**

Before his parachute descent on Scotland, the outside world had heard little of this somber, ruthless Nazi chief. People remembered vaguely of often seeing him beside Der Fuehrer in photographs, but he wasn't a world celebrity like Hermann Goerring, Joachim von Ribbentrop or Joseph Goebbels.

Germany, however, accorded Hess great respect than any other Nazi except the Fuehrer. They called him "Adolf Hitler's shadow."

When the war began Hitler designated Hess as first in line after Goering in case anything happened to himself. But many observers regarded Hess as the probable actual successor to Hitler's office. He has been in power in 1933 he gave Hess command of all Nazi Party affairs, conferring with Hitler as a synonym of devotion to Hitler.
