

New Regulations Called Radio "Death Warrant

It originates with the CBS chain and takes the form of an analysis in 33 printed pages of "What the New Radio Rules Mean" from that network's standpoint.

Denying that the regulations comprise a "Magna Carta" for radio, the brochure declares they are more of a "death warrant." Furthermore, it asserts that the mmission's method of announcle them was "like calling a blitsing a rescue party."

"It will threaten the very existence of present network broadcasting service, bring confusion to radio listeners, to radio stations and to users of radio; it will threaten the continuance to radio listeners of their favorite sustaining programs sent out by the networks; it will establish radio monpolies in many sections which are now served by competing stations and networks; it may, in the end, encourage the government to take over broadcasting altogether; it will cripple, if it does not paralyze, broadcasting as a national service at a time when radio should be encouraged to continue and enlarge its contribution to national unity and morale."
