### Greeting Sent To All British

Cable to Its Mother Churches Climax of Episcopal Convocation.

Manchest. May 21.—(D-1941)—The Protestant Episcopal church in Connecticut climaxed its annual convention here yesterday by sending greetings of admiration, sympathy and encouragement to its mother churches of England and Scotland and to all the British people.

The resolution sent to the Archbishop of Canterbury by Connecticut, the oldest diocese of Anglican communion outside the British Isles, was introduced by the Rev. Louis L. Perkins, rector of the Church of Good Shepherd, Shelton.

Previously, Bishop Frederick G. Hudson expressed his personal opinion that the United States should go "all out" for Britain.

Five members were elected to the Standing Committee and Executive Council of the diocese, and deputies and supplementary deputies were chosen to the group of the first province.
