

Reach Agreement For Settling Milk Control Disputes

Republicans to Remove Appeals Section on New Evidence and Democrats to Yield on Equalization Fund Plan They Favor.

State Capitol, Hartford, May 23.—(P)—Republican and Democratic leaders reached a compromise on the milk control bill today in conferences called after the issue had been brought to a head with the House passage of a measure by Gov. Robert A. Hurley as "absolutely unacceptable."

The disaffection has spread, McEntee said, into camps in the Second and Third Army Corps embracing New York, New Jersey, Delaware, Maryland, Pennsylvania, District of Columbia, and Virginia.

Gov. Hurley last night asserted the House appeals section would strike a "mortal blow" at effective administration of a milk act by permitting cases to drag through the courts.

Madden said the new appeals section agreed upon would bar new evidence before the courts, but would permit a court to order a retrial of the case before the administrator if it was shown important new evidence had been uncovered since he made his decision.

Stays would be granted in appeals from orders revoking licenses. The agreement between leaders on the milk issue gave rise to hopes, observers said, that Legislature might be able to avoid a jam on legislation and patronage during the final days of its deliberations.

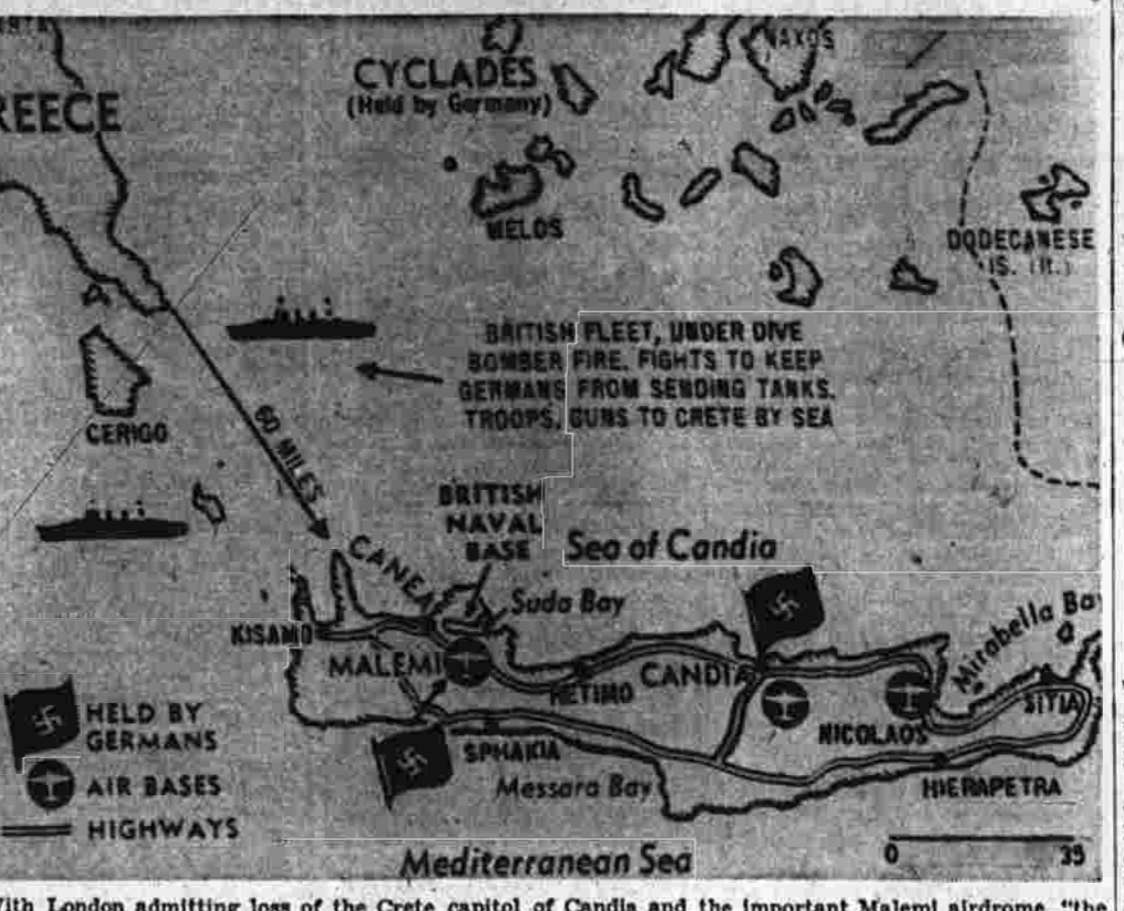
The Marsh nomination requires a two-thirds vote of the General Assembly.

Nazi Air-Borne Units Beaten at 2 Places; Destroyers Targets

German Claim Three British Destroyers Are Sunk and Two Others Damaged by Dive-Bombers in Mediterranean; Five Speed Boats Also Claimed Destroyed by Planes.

Berlin, May 23.—(P)—Three British destroyers were sunk and two others damaged today by German dive-bombers in the Mediterranean, German news agency reported.

Five of six British speed boats entering an eastern Mediterranean Naval base also were destroyed by German warplanes, the agency said. German crews, in addition, claimed to have left two British cruisers aflame after dive-bomber attacks.

One of the damaged destroyers also was said to have burned. Claim Sweeping Victory These reports supplemented those of yesterday's action, which German asserted constituted a sweeping victory over British forces in the eastern Mediterranean. Her previous claims: Four cruisers, several destroyers and one submarine sent to the bottom by the Luftwaffe yesterday and the day before.

One battleship, two destroyers and a number of smaller vessels were reported to have been sunk yesterday's special announcement of the Luftwaffe, said the agency. The Luftwaffe scored a hit after hit upon virtually all types of British warships.

It did not repeat the detailed claim in last night's special announcement that four cruisers and several destroyers had been sunk and that a battleship and two other destroyers were damaged.

Submarine Added to List The submarine was added to the list of British losses by informed sources who said it was hit by a heavy bomb as it tried to dive to cover.

Today's communiqué said simply that "the heaviest losses" were inflicted by the Luftwaffe in its joint with British seapower. It gave no location for the battle other than the eastern Mediterranean, even-though the Crete region undoubtedly was meant.

Must Have Thousands To Meet Roosevelt's Stepped-Up Bomber Production Program.

Boston, May 23.—(P)—The United States "must have thousands and thousands more precision tool makers" to meet President Roosevelt's stepped-up bombing production program, Merrill C. Meigs of the Office of Production Administration said today.

"The great need—the greatest need—for tool makers is the use of precision tools," the chief of OPA's Aircraft Section said in addressing the second annual Aviation Conference of New England.

Predicting 400,000 men would be working in the nation's aviation industry by the end of next year, he said the number last January was 100,000, compared with 8,000 less than 10 years ago.

"In May, 1940, the aircraft industry turned out 500 planes," he said. "The monthly production figures have been steadily rising. We in America have raised our production to 1,000 planes a month."
