

### Early Sees Berlin Trying to Becloud Talk by Roosevelt

Presidential Secretary Adds He Would Not Be Surprised If Reporters Query Him About More Berlin Dispatches Before Talk

Bulletin! Washington, May 26.—(P)—Secretary of State Hull accused Germany today of seeking by threats to induce the United States to refrain from any real efforts at self defense.

Hull made this comment on the statement yesterday of Grand Admiral Erich Raeder, commander of the German Navy, that the American patrol system was "aggressive" and that American Naval convoys for British ships would "mean shooting." Hull told his press conference that Raeder's statement appeared to be some sort of threat to induce this country and probably other American nations to refrain from real efforts at self defense until Adolf Hitler gets control of the high seas of the world and other continents.

Washington, May 26.—(P)—Stephen Early, presidential secretary, said today he had an idea that Berlin is trying to do anything it can to becloud President Roosevelt's fireside chat tomorrow night. He made that statement when reporters informed him that the German Foreign Office was commenting on an interview in which Grand Admiral Erich Raeder, commander of the German Navy, warned the United States against convoys and patrolling.

Germany Asserts British Mediterranean Fleet Has Suffered 'Devastating' Blow in Matching Its Strength With Luftwaffe in Battle of Crete; Cruiser Section Wiped Out.

Berlin, May 26.—(P)—The British Mediterranean fleet has suffered a "devastating" blow in matching its strength with the Luftwaffe in the battle of Crete and "important reverses no longer are reckoned with" by Germany, the highly placed commentary Dienst Aus Deutschland declared tonight. Authorized military spokesmen, commenting on the high command's report of heavy destruction wrought among the British warships, declared the Germans and Italians virtually had wiped out the cruiser section of the Royal Navy's Eastern Mediterranean fleet.

Of 12 cruisers the Germans said were known to have been based at Alexandria, the high command said 11 had been sunk.

German Air and Italian Naval Air forces combined to sink "enemy" cruisers, eight destroyers, one submarine and five torpedo boats and damaged one battleship and several more cruisers and destroyers in the eastern Mediterranean since last Tuesday, the German high command announced today.

In addition to this summary of the fighting since the Battle of Crete began, the war bulletin said that yesterday Luftwaffe blasted British positions on the island itself, setting munitions dumps afire and destroyed two merchant ships.

Six British planes were declared destroyed by yesterday's air fighting, including three bombers and three fighters, with an additional three A. F. planes destroyed, on the ground.

In the forays against the British Mediterranean fleet since the battle started, the Germans said the Luftwaffe accounted for seven of the British cruisers, including some anti-aircraft destroyers.

Italians Aver Planes Aiding Crete Attack

Rome, May 26.—(P)—The Italian high command declared today that the attack on Crete, repeatedly bombing and machine-gunning throughout on the island, was managed to land some by plane.

The assault started after additional air-borne reinforcements had been landed, the war bulletin said, adding that the Imperial troops inflicted heavy casualties on the Germans.

Europe's Food Supply Seen Sufficient Until Harvests

Washington, May 26.—(P)—The Agriculture Department reported today that most countries of continental Europe apparently have sufficient food supplies to maintain their populations until new harvests replenish stocks.

It explained that present rationing, while generally below normal consumption, appear sufficient to prevent serious distress.

Acute shortages were said to exist in a few areas, particularly in parts of France, Belgium and The Netherlands. Further curtailment of rations in these countries would be necessary before the new harvest, the department said.

No Food Crisis for Germany

The department was said to have no food crisis ahead for Nazi Germany.

"The war has not yet seriously interfered with agricultural production in Germany," the department said. "Although the high level of output of recent years will doubtless be subject to some decline because of certain shortfalls of labor, draft, power and fertilizers, this decline should not be abrupt or disastrous."

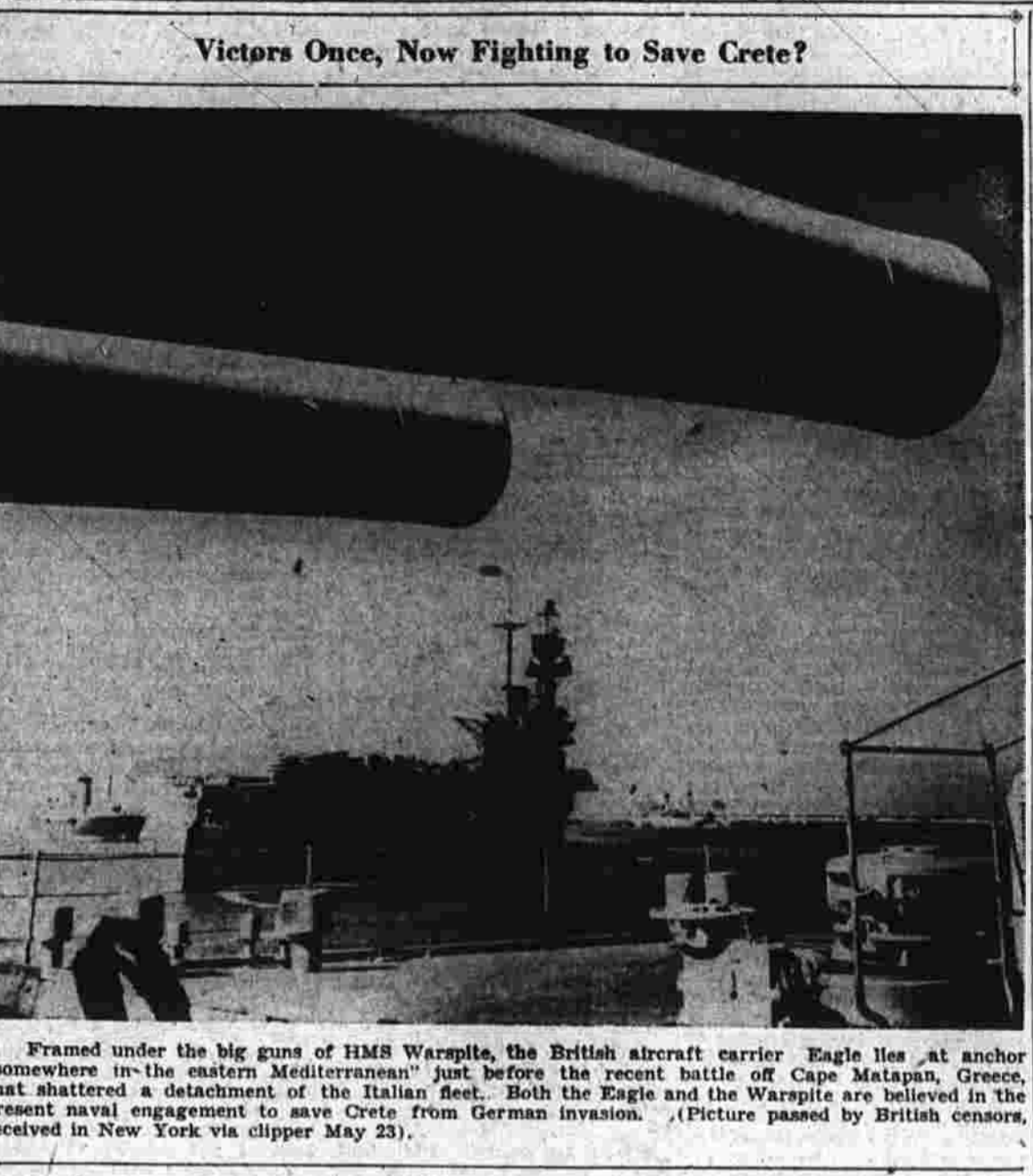

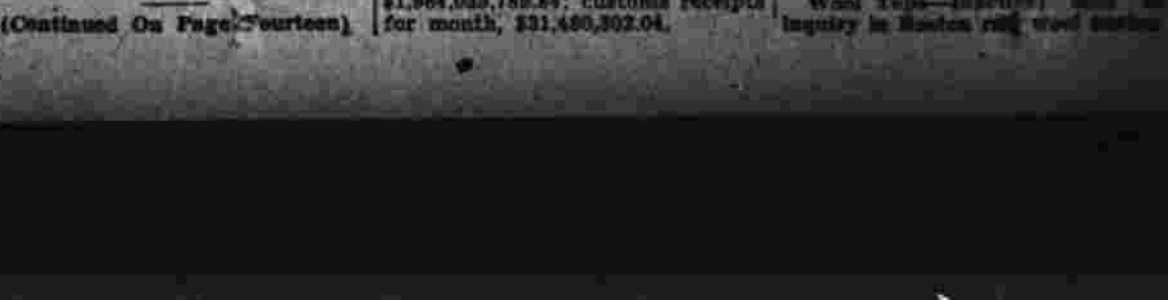
