

Hadden Announces Refusal to Accept New Judge's Post

Rejects Appointment to One of Three New Common Pleas Positions Created in Bill Which He Guided Safely Through House.

State Capitol, Hartford, June 2.—(P)—Republican sources reported today that the Common Pleas judgeship rejected by Republican Floor Leader William L. Hadden was not the one after which he had refused to accept it. The offer to Alcorn, it was reported, was made through Executive Secretary James E. Murphy, who got in touch with the governor at Vermont shortly after Hadden announced in the House that he would not accept the post.

State Capitol, Hartford, June 2.—(P)—Republican Floor Leader William L. Hadden rejected today an appointment to one of three new Common Pleas judgeships created in a bill which he guided safely through the strife-torn House. He announced his refusal to accept the \$9,500-a-year post to the bill Saturday after a bitter fight against the creation of the new judgeships.

The 44-year-old Republican chairman, whose nomination for the judgeship was announced by Governor Hurley a few minutes after the Legislature approved the bill, told the House:

"I had no agreement direct or otherwise with any person in the state of Connecticut, that passage of the bill was going to mean a job for me."

As the representatives cheered, Hadden continued: "So there will be no question about it in anybody's mind, I hereby refuse the offered reward." Before his announcement in the House, Hadden conferred with Republican associates and then with James E. Murphy, the governor's executive secretary. The governor was not at the capital, having left Connecticut Saturday for the week-end after his appointment to the judgeship was announced.

When that time comes and there are no reserves to meet the inevitable counter-offensive, how is the military genius of the Germans going to save itself from final defeat?

Radio 'Hams' Play Part In National Defense

(No. 1 in Series)

The modern war machine has taken on the character of a monstrous mechanical robot. Its feet are the huge tanks, trucks and combat cars that carry the mechanized army, and its hands are the aircraft and artillery that reach out behind the enemy's lines. Its muscular system is the vast body of trained soldiers, its brain the leadership of field and staff officers—and its nervous system the communications web that carries intelligence between that brain and the most extended parts of the whole giant military machine.

The operation of this complex system is the signal Corps in the Army, and the radio operators in the Air Corps and the Navy. These radio operators, who have been given up their normal activities by the hundreds and thousands, are the backbone of the national defense effort.
