





Each night great fleets of long, richly laden trains slip swiftly down the curving main line of the New York, New Haven and Hartford Railroad, funneling off from a thousand mills and shops the day's accumulation of industrial treasure. Along the express tracks, they high-ball often approaching the speed of the road's fastest passenger trains, they operate on inflexible schedules.

Trickle is Early Afternoon

It s early afternoon in cities in northern and central New England when, by truck and connecting rail, line, the trickle starts that hours later will send thousands of tons of merchandise tumbling into receiving yards in Boston, Worcester and Springfield.

As cars are shunted from connecting lines and sweating truck

As cars are shunted from con-necting lines and sweating truck drivers pile their loads on waiting platforms, the first of the nightly freight expresses begins to take shape. Cars are assembled in blocs by destination and, as departure hour nears, these are put together in the pre-determined order in which they later will be detached. which they later will be detached. which they later will be detached.
Darkness has fallen now and the right of way glistens in the red green and yellow lights of the semaphores as the speeding train pours down the ever narrowing strip of Connecticut that leads to the gateway of the western world. The locomotive, lost to sight a couple of curves ahead, becomes visible briefly as the train pulls across Hell Gate bridge, then begins the long descent across lower Long Island to the Bay Ridge yards.

Tugs Awalt Train

There waiting tugs, towering above lighters lashed to their sides, swait the train and hardly 20 minutes has elapsed before the first ferry with perhaps 40 cars aboard has started across the misty waters of the harbor to its destination on the New Jersey shore. Mournful buoys sound as the tug and her convoys tread busy waters, where dark hulled ships bide their time before vanishing at sea. On the New York side and again on the New Jersey shore some of the cars destined only for the metropolitan area and for export are left behind before the train takes up its run once more, hastening ever onward to keep schedule with trains awaiting its arrival in yarus the country-over.
