Roosevelt Pushes River Power Plan As Defense Need

Wallace Says Rights Must Be Defended

Washington, June 5.—(AP)—President Roosevelt, saying that "we have no right to take chances with the national safety," recommended to Congress today legislation authorizing immediate construction of the St. Lawrence seaway and power project. Declaring that no comparable power, shipbuilding and transportation facilities could be made available in the time required to construct the project, which would be done jointly with Canada, the president said:

"Production and more production is the key to our all-out race for national defense. Electric power and transportation are limiting factors in the production of planes, guns, tanks and ships. Every developing, every resource we have must be developed. We are developing every hydro-electric resource and every waterway from Norway to the Dardanelles. As we to allow this continent to be outmatched because short-sighted interests oppose the development of one of our greatest resources?"

Mr. Roosevelt declared he had been advised the project could be built in four years, adding: "Under emergency pressure it may be completed in less time. I should like to agree with the people who say that the country's danger will be over sooner than that."

"But the course of world events gives no such assurance; and we have no right to take chances with the national safety. I know of no single project of this nature more important to this country's future in peace or war. Its authorization will demonstrate to the enemies of democracy that, however long the effort, we intend to outstrip them in the race of production in the modern world, that race determined by the rise and fall of nations."

"I hope that authorization will not be delayed."

The St. Lawrence project, which would open an ocean going seaway from the Great Lakes to the Atlantic and provide for increased power facilities on the Canadian American border in northern New York, originally was presented to Congress in treaty form. It failed of ratification when the Senate refused to give it the required two-thirds vote.

Now having been introduced in bill form, the project requires only a majority vote in both Houses. The cost to the United States has been estimated at \$250,000,000, upwards of \$60,000,000 of this to be repaid the government by New York state for use of the increased power.

On Sale Today

Placed on Market But Not in Large Quantities - Rain Helps.
Native strawberries are in the market. The rain of yesterday and today prevented picking on a large scale, and the few crates brought to local stores this morning are being offered at 25 cents a quart. Growers in this territory are paid 20 cents a basket at the farms and in cases where they have a few crates to bring to the local stores they are paid 20 cents a quart by the store keepers.

No Complaints
Native berries should not be confused with strawberries offered in some stores at 15 cents a quart and in some cases two quarts for 25 cents. These are imported from New Jersey. New Jersey berries never did equal the quality of local berries.

The rain has not injured the berries. They are so far advanced that they will be better able to withstand a hot spell. In only a small section of the territory that will furnish berries to the auction market when it opens next Sunday are berries now being picked.
Native berries offered today were picked this morning and are more solid than those that have been brought in from out of the state, which were picked yesterday and had to be trucked into the state.

Berries offered as early as 8 o'clock this morning for sale in local stores were in nearly every case from out of the state, the local berries not coming into the stores until about 10 o'clock.

Supt. of Local Hospital Among Delegates to Visit Camp Edwards.

Dr. H. C. Smith, superintendent of the Memorial Hospital, was a member of the delegation of 600 from the Massachusetts Hospital Association invited to inspect the station hospital and the 101st Medical Regiment at Camp Edwards, Falmouth, Cape Cod on Tuesday. The association was met by Lieut.-Colonel Harry A. Clark, camp medical commander at 10:30 in the assembly building and gave them the hospital and administrative buildings.

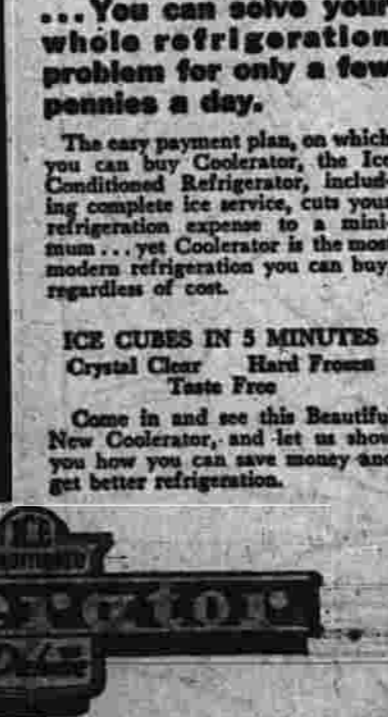
