Speaker Calls On Youth to Spread American Ideals

Dr. McConaughy Tells High School Graduates It Is Up to the Youth of Nation to Take Active Part in the Nation's Democracy.

Calling on the youth of the nation for unity in purpose, direction of their efforts toward perfection, and the nurturing of idealism that does not count material effect as its gauge, Dr. James L. McConaughy, this morning urged members of the Class of 1941, of the Manchester High School, to take an active part in the firm grounding of their American democracy. The speaker, president of Wesleyan University and former lieutenant-governor of the state, held out to his listeners the example of Giberti, sculptor of the famous bronze doors of the cathedral in Florence, as one they might pattern their own lives on drawing from his subject the objective he had set for the graduating students. The class of 1941 was one of the largest ever to receive diplomas.

Door For Cathedral
Giberti, Dr. McConaughy related, as a young man of 23 won a European contest for his design of new doors for the Florence cathedral, religious center of what was, in the 14th century, one of the most potent democracies of the continent.

Laborer Fifty Years
At 73 Giberti, hearing death, felt his task as near completion as he could bring it. He permitted his doors to be hung. But before that, for over a half century, he had labored on the doors, discarding set after set of them because he felt they did not portray his capabilities or repay the trust of the city-state reposed in him.

Material Reward
He labored, Dr. McConaughy pointed out, without material reward. He labored only through co-operation with others, his youngest apprentice, and he devoted his life toward the attainment of perfection. So exquisite was the result that years afterward Michelangelo remarked the gates were so perfect they might be the doors of paradise.

Enduring Acclaim
The enduring acclamations of the ages are won and established only by such devotion as that of Giberti, Dr. McConaughy said. He warned that only by such means can our own civilization be preserved.

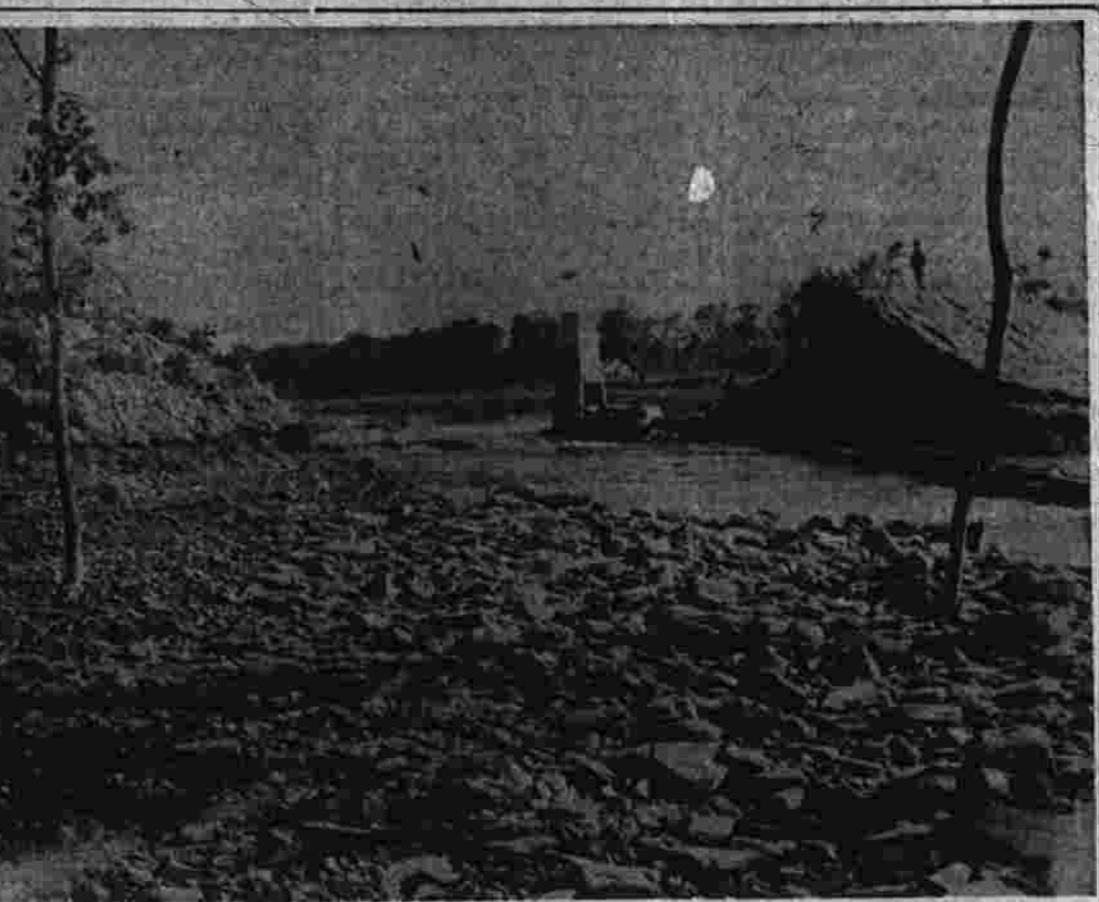

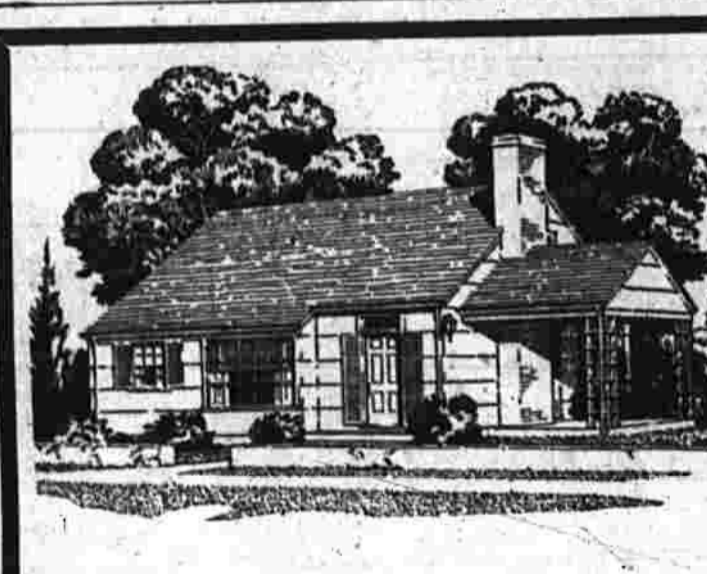
