

Votes to Condemn Defense Industry Strikes, Lockouts

Senate Favors Amendment to Connolly Proposal on Taking Over Plants; Hits Either Disputant Refusing To Accept Mediation.

Bulletin!
Washington, June 12.—(AP)—The Senate approved legislation today to give President Roosevelt specific statutory authority to take over defense plants where there is an existing or threatened failure of production and management or labor have failed to utilize existing mediation agencies. Approval of the measure came after administration forces lost a fight against an amendment by Senator Ball (R., Minn.) which provided in effect that the president could not exercise such powers until mediation attempts were exhausted. The vote approving the Connolly proposal was 67 to 7.

Murray Raps Plan to Curb Halt on Jobs

Washington, June 12.—(AP)—The Senate voted 46 to 25 today to condemn defense industry strikes or lockouts where either disputant refuses to abide by the results of mediation or arbitration. The chamber approved an amendment by Senator Byrnes (D., Va.), to a proposal by Senator Connolly (D., Tex.), which would give the president statutory power to take over defense plants where production is tied up or threatened by strikes or lockouts. Final action on the Connolly proposal was 46 to 25.

Sumner Welles, acting secretary of state, made the announcement at his press conference. Stephen Early, presidential secretary, said the full report is expected Monday, but it might be later. It must be satisfied by officials here, he said, before a course of action, if any, is set.

"I sincerely believe that the cause of democracy and the democratic way of life throughout the world will be gravely damaged if we do not win this war. Consequently we feel that anyone who recommends shooting war for us is not only postponing peace and democracy for the rest of the world but also hastening the end of democracy and what we call life throughout the world."

It is to be expected that Mr. Bissell would be a little more friendly, with rather more concern to making it resonant than to making it logical. Because he and his associates must be very well aware that unless we do join in this war and, together with Britain and her present allies, crush the Nazi juggernaut, there will be no smallest shred of democracy remaining anywhere throughout the world—save such as may for a brief time survive in the Americas.

Connecticut's Vocational schools were among the first in the country and the best in the Nation, declared Augustus S. Boynton, director of Vocational Education for the State of Connecticut last night at the graduation exercises for the Trade School here. Fifty-two students, the largest class in the history of the school, were graduated, receiving their diplomas from Representative Charles S. House, at the close of the graduating exercises which were attended by members of the High school faculty and friends of the grade.

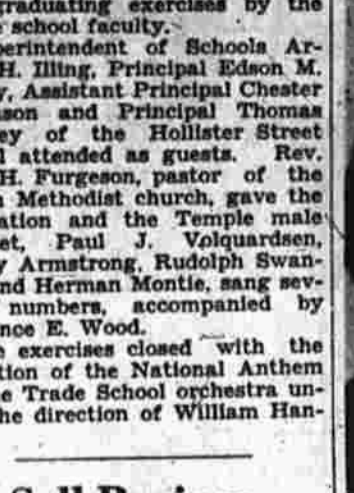
To Sell Recipes To Help British

"British Recipes, Old and New," is the title of a book recently issued for the benefit of British War Relief, samples of which are on exhibit at the local branch headquarters in the British-American club on Maple street and orders are being received. The book also bears the British emblem and contains old and new English, Irish, Scotch and Welsh recipes, and three-fourths of the amount received for each book will be retained by the local branch for the promotion of its work.

The speaker outlined the process of establishing vocational schools in Connecticut from 1903 when the first school was authorized and classes started in New Britain, through to 1910 when other schools were opened in Putnam, Bridgeport, Willimantic and Manchester. He advised young men to learn a trade and declared that there will be a definite shortage of other tradesmen after the war as at the present time more than the average number of boys are learning the machinists trade.

The speaker told the graduates to "stick to the job" and to continue to improve their standing in the trade, for individual benefit and for the general good of the Nation.

Since the inauguration of the state's vocational training program for national defense jobs, the program has been increased three times and it is expected that further increases may be necessary to supply industry working on national defense jobs an ample force of trained operatives.

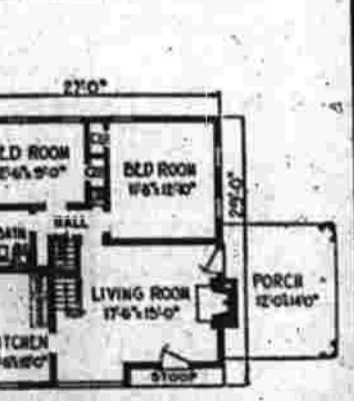
