

Welles Says Basic Claims in Sinking Remain Unchanged

Government Soon Will Be in Position to Reach Final Decision on Action to Be Taken in Regard to Destruction of Robin Moor.

Washington, June 17.—(AP)—Secretary of State Welles today said the government's basic charges against Germany for the sinking of the American merchant ship Robin Moor were unchanged by the arrival of 35 missing survivors at Capetown yesterday. Welles said that with the evidence already available from 11 survivors landed last week in Brazil and a cable summary expected on the testimony of those at Capetown, South Africa, the government very soon would be in a position to reach a final decision on the action to be taken.

Will Travel Same Road As Canada

The budget for Manchester's schools for the year 1941-42 as approved by the School Board last evening will be \$403,549, an increase of \$23,549 over that of last year. The board met to make the final check before presenting the figures at the meeting of the Joint Board this afternoon at 5 o'clock.

Room Not Needed.
