John was the eighth duke of Braganza, He was crowned king of Portugal on Dec. 13, 1640, only two weeks after he led the insurrection against Spain. Previously, Portugal had been under Spanish domination for 60 years, although Philip II, king of Spain at the time of the conquest, promised Portugal was to remain a separate state. Under Philip IV, however, Margaret of Savoy was given royal authority over Portugal, and her lavish disregard of Portuguese interests soon aroused the people.






