Britain Considers Giving Russia Aid If Reich Attacks

Question of Support of United States for Plan Consideration in Weighing Policy; Fliers Engage in Unprecedented Offensive.

London, June 20.—(AP)—The British weighed today a policy of aid to Soviet Russia in event she, and not Britain, is next to Adolf Hitler's invasion schedule. The question of such a plan was a consideration. But, on the chance that Hitler would be able to strike a bloodless bargain with Joseph Stalin, freeing the Germans for an all-out thrust against the British Isles, the R.A.F. was engaged in an unprecedented offensive of obstruction.

Last night was the ninth successive night in which the R.A.F. had pounded either the German bases on the invasion coast or industries and communications in western Germany or both. This time the targets were industrial Cologne and Düsseldorf.

Some British sources, following the lead of The London Standard, a newspaper published by Minister of State Lord Beaverbrook, a key figure in the Churchill government, declared that if the Russians go to war against Britain's enemy "they would be our Allies and it is reasonable we would give them whatever aid possible."

There was no speculation, however, as to what form that aid might take. The Standard noted the problem of the United States attitude when it said Britain should try "to make our friends the Americans understand the reasons for a British-Russian alliance against Germany if ever the alliance is deemed necessary."

Most observers felt that Britain would be Hitler's next all-out objective when he could settle with Russia—either by parleys or Panzer divisions.
