

Sunken Submarine O-9 and Crew May Remain on Floor of Atlantic Ocean

Reparations Note On Moor's Sinking Is Expected Soon

Considered Foregone Conclusion Official Representations Will Include Direct Warning Against Further Molestation of Ships.

Washington, June 21.—(AP)—A strong note demanding that Germany make full reparations for the sinking of the S.S. Robin Moor was expected today to be dispatched swiftly to Berlin following President Roosevelt's message to Congress branding the sinking "the act of an international outlaw." It was considered a foregone conclusion that this nation's official representations would include a direct warning against any further molestation of American shipping.

The President in his message interpreted the sinking as "a warning that the United States may use the high seas of the world only with Nazi consent." To yield to such control, he asserted, would mean that "we would inevitably submit to world domination at the hands of the present leaders of the German Reich. We are not yielding and we do not propose to yield," he concluded.

Sticks to Established Policy The President withheld any indication of the means which would be used to make this forceful declaration effective. In this he adhered to his established policy of keeping the Axis leaders guessing. Speculation here centered on the possibility that the Navy might receive orders to intercept the vessel.

In general, the idea of arming merchant ships was discounted. The speed, mobility and firepower of raiders—surface, sub-surface and aerial—have increased significantly since World War days when gun crews were placed aboard merchant ships.

Comments Vary Congressional comments on the message varied from Senator Byrnes (D, S. C.) "I heartily subscribe to it" to Senator Clegg (R, N. C.) "I am not sure that it is wise."

Depth Is Too Great For Divers to Work Safely, Knox Avers

Portsmouth, N. H., June 21.—(AP)—A possibility that the sunken submarine O-9 and her crew of 33 dead might be left on the ocean floor, entombed under a compression of 440 feet of water that has crumpled the craft's steel hull, was sounded today by the Navy's high command.

Secretary of the Navy Frank Knox, unshaven and obviously deeply concerned, told newsmen that "at that depth it is impossible for divers to conduct salvage operations so far as we now know."
