Mobilizing Military Might
Called upon by Foreign Commiscar Vyachesiav Molotov, speaking yesterday in the name of Premier Joseph Stalin, to "deal a crushing blow" to the Reich, Russia was mobilizing her military might from her western frontier to Siberia.

(Moscow radio broadcasts heard last night in New York said heavy Army units were streaming through the capital, headed for the front, along with the tanks and motorized artillery and anti-aircraft batteries that have been Russia's pride in military paradea.)

Martial law was imposed in the westernmost Soviet republics from the Karelian-Finnish state created from gains from Finland in 1940, south to the Crimea.

Mobilisation was ordered in all western military districts as the Red Army called to the colors 1s claspes of men-from the ages of 23 through 36—to bolster the hundreds of thousands already at the front and on the march.


Immediately after World War I, Hungary set up the People's Republic with Count Karolyi as provisional president. This form of government lasted until March of the following year when the Soviet Republic was set up under Bela Kun. This attempt to emulate the Russian Communist form of government lasted only a few months before the Soviet regime was deposed and a Socialist government came into power.

Today Hungary is definitely in the grip of Nazi Germany, one of the victims of "bloodless conquest."
