

Nazi Legions Drive Ahead 'on Schedule'; Red Army Moves Vast Masses to Fight

Attack on Russia Called Treachery By United States

Rallying of Forces Opposing Hitlerism Is Seen Redounding to Benefit of American Defense and Security In Welles' Statement.

Washington, June 23.—(AP)—The United States condemned Germany's "treacherous attack" on Russia today and declared that "any rallying of the forces opposing Hitlerism" would redound to the benefit of American defense and security. The statement made by Sumner Welles, undersecretary of state, after he had conferred with President Roosevelt left open the question of whether lend-lease aid would be given to Soviet Russia.

Welles said no communication had been received from the Soviet government as yet and consequently the question had not been decided by the American government.

Roosevelt Has Authority

He said, however, that President Roosevelt had authority under the lend-lease act to furnish any country resisting aggression.

The formal declaration of policy read by Welles at a large press conference declared the immediate issue before the American people was whether Hitler's plan for universal conquest was to be successfully halted and defeated.

"In the opinion of this government," Welles said, "consequently any defense against Hitlerism, any rallying of the forces opposing Hitlerism, from whatever source, any aid we may give, will hasten the eventual downfall of the present German leaders and will therefore redound to the benefit of our own defense and security."

"Hitler's armies are today the chief dangers of the American continent," Welles said.

What position Japan would take in the sharply altered situation was one subject of considerable interest, but Tokyo was slow to answer.

Hope Parleys Will Settle Ship Strike

Navy Officials Expect Conference Will Pave Way to Peace in Machinists Dispute.

Navy officials in the San Francisco bay area hoped conference today would pave the way for settlement of an 11-shipyard strike of CIO and AFL machinists which has hampered production on \$500,000,000 of defense work.

Expressing confidence that the government would not have to use force to break the deadlock, Admiral J. W. Greenleaf said yesterday he hoped the meeting would produce a decision on "what course and action is to be followed."

"All parties concerned" would take part in the discussion, the admiral said. "So that each side may know precisely where the other stands."

Called by Machinists

The strike, now in its seventh week, was called by the machinists to support demands for \$1.15 an hour and double overtime pay.

They rejected an offer of \$1.13 an hour and pay and a half for overtime which compared with their previous contract of \$1 and double time.

Strikers voted 1200 to 174 yesterday against accepting a company proposal for ending a strike at the American Fork and Chemtuley Company, Fremont, Calif.

They walked out March 14, demanding that the wage scale of 67 1/2 cents be restored.

Improper Acts Claims Denied

Italians Informed of American Rules for Obtaining Money.

Rome, June 23.—(AP)—United States Ambassador William Phillips delivered to the Italian government today a note in which Washington rejected the Italian charges that United States consular officials "whom Italy has demanded be withdrawn" had acted improperly.

In an attempt to obtain relief for Americans in Italy whose bank accounts are blocked, the ambassador also informed the Foreign Ministry of regulations under which Italians may obtain money in the United States.

To Leave Within Week

American consular officials are planning to leave Italy within a week in accordance with Italian orders for their expulsion.

An authoritative source said Italian regulations for the withdrawal of funds of Americans in Italy had not yet been fixed, but added that the question was no longer of a technical nature.

The matter has reached the stage of "sovereign decrees" in both countries, the source said, and is no longer subject to elastic compromise.

The banks are still refusing to allow Americans to make even the smallest withdrawals for personal expenses.

British Fliers Destroy More German Fighters

Seven Victories Today Bring Total for Last Three Days to 64; Naval Base Pounded.

London, June 23.—(AP)—Making an offensive sweep over northern France, British fighters today destroyed seven German fighters, bringing the total for the last three days to 64.

"Less opposition was encountered across the channel than we had anticipated," an authoritative statement said.

Accompanied by Bombers

British fighters were accompanied by bombers which destroyed a number of German fighters. It was acknowledged that two R. A. F. fighters were missing.

The raid followed up the 12th straight night assault on German forces in the English Channel. The big Naval base at Wilhelmshaven and other targets were also pounded.

Prime Minister Churchill's ringing declaration yesterday that "we shall give whatever help we can to Russia, and we shall not flinch from any sacrifice" was reinforced today by reports of the destruction of German fighters.

They advocated a burial of ideological differences between Britain and Communist Russia for the common purpose of crushing Adolf Hitler.

"We need have no fear that we shall weaken in our resolve here in Britain because Hitler is now splitting his venom at the east," The News Chronicle declared. "He has given ourselves clear."
