Senators Support Aid for Russians in Fighting Nazis

Sharp Counterblast of Opposition by Clark Who Denounces Stalin And Communists; Endorse Declaration of State Department.

Washington, June 24.—(P)—The idea of aiding Russia in her fight against Germany gained substantial backing in the Senate today, but not without a sharp counterblast of opposition from Senator Clark (D., Mo.), who declared "Stalin's hand is just as bloody as Hitler's, the Communist system is just as bad as Nazism." The general trend of initial opinion in the Senate appeared to endorse the official State Department declaration that "any defense against Hitlerism" redounded to the benefit of the defense and security of the United States.

The State Department announcement yesterday was regarded as tantamount to a formal notice that the reorganized American policy toward the Soviet would parallel Britain's. In brief, the United States and Britain, while yielding no ground in their ideological antagonism to Communism, would support Russia as a fighter against a common menace.

Bath, Me., June 24.—(P)—Defense counsel in the murder trial of Dr. Merrill E. Jones, 34, alleged wife-slayer, bluntly declared in preliminary statements today that the physician "knew nothing whatever of who killed" his wife or "how she came to her death."

It was the state's contention that Dr. Jones desired "to get rid" of his wife because of his attraction for another woman. He pleaded innocent yesterday.

Ernest L. Goodspeed, associate counsel for the former Vahalla, N. Y., hospital intern, told the Sagadahoc county jury, "he's not mixed up in her death in any way."

Jury Views Scene After Attorney General Frank I. Cowan had outlined circumstances of Mrs. Jones' death which followed a brutal beating in her home March 27, and Goodspeed's testimony that his client's suit, the jury went to Richmond, a sleepy Kennebec river town 11 miles distant, and viewed the scene.

Spinal Fluid Withdrawn As Deafness Treatment

Strong Bunkers Line Of 'Reds' Shattered; Take 5,000 Prisoners

Huge Army Battling Furiously Against German Mechanized Columns on Far-Flung Black Sea Front; 300 German Tanks and 127 Warplanes Destroyed in Two Days of Fighting.

Moscow, June 24.—(P)—Russia's huge Red Army, battling furiously against German mechanized columns on the far-flung Baltic-to-Black Sea front, claimed today to have thrust two invading German forces back across the Soviet frontier. In the first two days of fighting against its first really powerful opponent, the Red Army claimed capture of 5,000 German prisoners, destruction of 300 German tanks and the shooting down of 127 Nazi warplanes.

The Soviet high command at the same time acknowledged the loss of three frontier towns—Brest-Litovsk, Kolno and Lomsa—as well as other penetrations into Sovietized Lithuania and eastern Poland.

In Ankara, reports received by foreign military attaches said the Bulgarian port of Varna, declared the Germans had entered during the first two days of fighting, while German-Rumanian forces slashing northward through Russian Bessarabia toward Odessa penetrated 80 miles into Soviet territory.

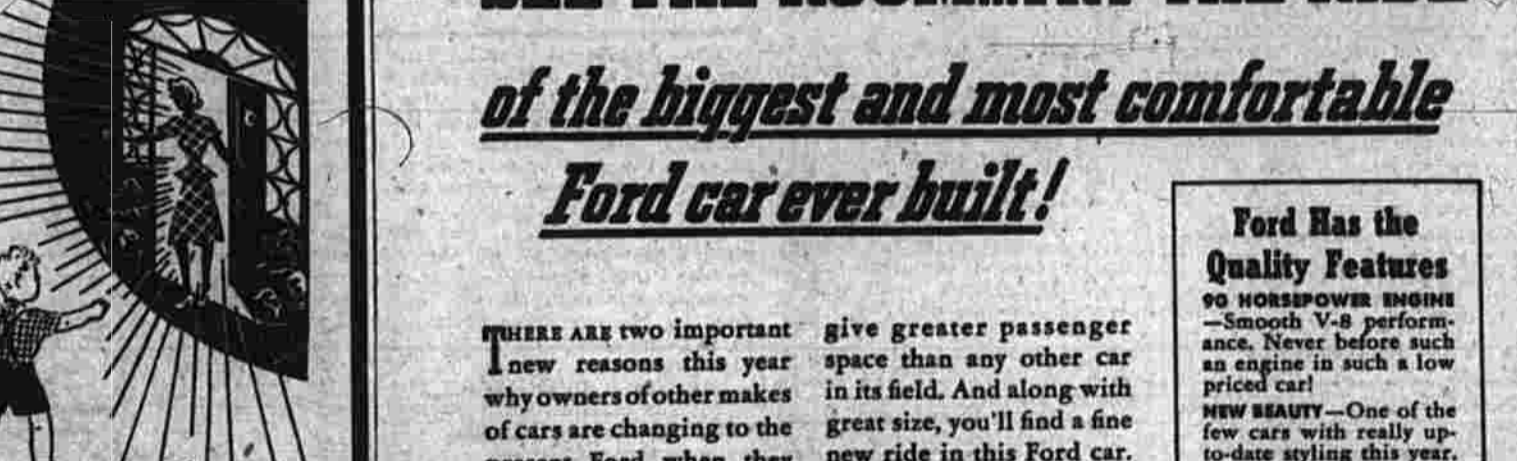

Throngs See Convoys Rush Through Town

551 U. S. Army Trucks In Three Sections Attract Hundreds as They Travel to N. Y. For four hours last night crowds gathered at different points in Manchester to watch the passing of 551 army trucks loaded with supplies and soldiers roll through the town under state and military police escort.

Tomorrow morning the advance guard of the convoy went through Manchester. There were about 25 trucks in the first group and many military police were in the first rank. They were stationed at different points along the route to guide the larger number of trucks that followed.

It was intended to start the convoys from North Main street at 11 o'clock, but because of the heavy traffic the start was delayed until about 11:30. Leaving the first street shortly after 11:30 the first of the trucks reached the Center between 11:45 and 7:45 last night.

In Three Divisions Because of the large number of trucks, the state police arranged to have them reach the Center in three divisions. The first division, composed of 240 trucks and the remainder coming through the Center.

It was also not announced that Manchester about two hours later than they did. In taking care of the trucks, the state police and the local police used their radios to good advantage.

Seeds Under Attack One of the most serious threats to the convoys was the attack on the trucks by birds. The state police used gas to drive the birds away.

Leads By State Police Leading the military trucks was a state police car, followed by a truck with a load speared attachment. The convoys were led by state police cars.

Guided Along the Way At the intersection of Oakland street and Tolland street a military police car led the first 100 trucks through the town.

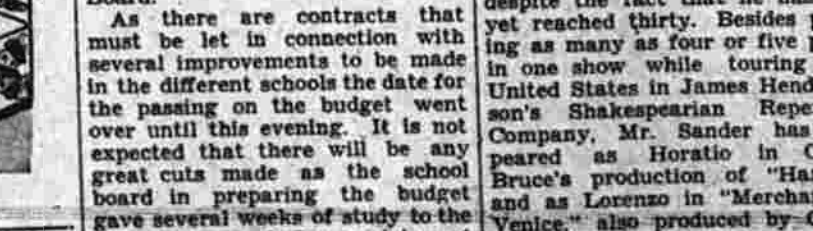

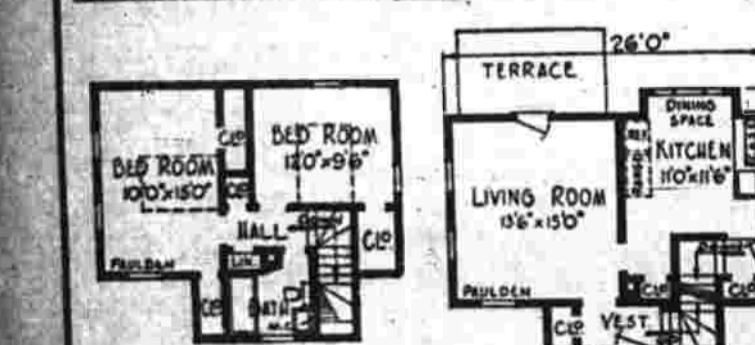
