—President Roosevelt does not intend to issue a neutrality proclamation in the Russian-German war, Acting Secretary of State Welles announced today. American ships thus will be permitted to carry arms to Russia's Pacific port of Vladivostok. The United States thereby will take the same position with reference to the Russian German war as it has maintained during the long undeclared war between Japan and China.
