American Vessels May Carry Arms To Russian Port

Roosevelt Does Not Intend to Issue Neutrality Proclamation In Russian-German War; Same Position as In Regard to China.

Washington, June 25.—(AP)—President Roosevelt does not intend to issue a neutrality proclamation in the Russian-German war, Acting Secretary of State Welles announced today. American ships thus will be permitted to carry arms to Russia's Pacific port of Vladivostok. The United States thereby will take the same position with reference to the Russian-German war as it has maintained during the long undeclared war between Japan and China. Welles noted that under the neutrality act a neutrality proclamation is called for when the president or Congress "shall find that there exists a state of war between foreign states and that it is necessary to promote or preserve the peace of the United States or to protect the lives of citizens of the United States."

British Shift Ways Taught Home Guards

London, June 25.—(AP)—Revolutionary changes in the tactics and training of 1,750,000 Home Guards now under arms are involved in a summer drive by the British Army to adjust this country's invasion-defenses to the lessons learned in Crete and Greece. The Royal Air Force already has begun campaigns to bolster the defenses.

Favors Funds To Buy More Naval Planes

2,236 Aircraft and 19 More Auxiliary Ships Recommended by Appropriations Group.

Washington, June 25.—(AP)—A \$297,083,825 deficiency appropriation, including funds to give the Navy 2,236 additional airplanes and 19 more auxiliary ships, was recommended to the House today by the Appropriations Committee. The measure, a "catch-all" money bill for the fiscal year ending June 30, carried funds for most a score of governmental agencies such as \$35,500,000 for the Office for Emergency Management; \$28,800,785 for the Post Office Department and \$15,000,450 for the Coast and Geodetic Survey. It also included money for the replacement of 10 cutters transferred to Great Britain and for construction of three new ice-breakers for duty in the Greenland area.

Bombers Roar Across Channel Twice Today

Follow Up 14th Successful Night Assault On Western Germany; 7 Nazi Planes Downed.

London, June 25.—(AP)—R. A. F. bombers roared across the channel twice today, once briefly in the morning and then in a heavier daylight smog this afternoon, following up their 14th successive night assault on western Germany. At least seven more German planes were added officially to the British claim of 121 destroyed in the past nine days of intensive air sweeps across the channel and the North Sea.

Results Will Be Given In Detail Tomorrow; 'Reds' Fight Fiercely

Warsaw and Constanta Left in Flames; Raids Made on Danzig and East Prussia; 381 German Planes Destroyed While Losing 374 of Own; Invaders Held At Standstill on Banks of Prut River.

Moscow, June 25.—(AP)—Trading blow for blow with the Luftwaffe, the Red Air Force reported today it had left Warsaw and Constanta in flames, raided Danzig and East Prussia, and destroyed 381 German planes against a three-day loss of 374 of its own aircraft. Along the troop-banked battlefield, a Soviet offensive declared, the Red Army was fighting fiercely to check Nazi drives into the Baltic states and old northern Poland, and was holding German and Rumanian forces to a standstill on the banks of the Prut river. The heading clash of the two largest armies in Europe was reported heavy in casualties and destruction, with big guns in action and powerful motorized and mechanized divisions following up the first stock of advance units.

Expect to Complete Occupation of Bessarabia Within Week, Rumanian Sources Avow.

Ankara, Turkey, June 24.—(DeLays)—(AP)—Combined German-Rumanian forces are meeting almost no opposition in Bessarabia and should complete occupation of the whole province within a week, Rumanian sources in Istanbul declared today. The allied Axis armies earlier were reported to have occupied both Cernavoda and Chisinau, capital respectively of Bucovina and Bessarabia which Soviet Russia obtained from Rumania a year ago by ultimatum.
