Reds Rout Threatening Panzer Column; Victories to Be Made Known Tomorrow

Congress Holding Unusual Sessions To Clean Up Bills

Both Houses Drive to Clear Legislative Jam Before Fiscal Year Ends; All Key Measures Are Expected to Be Passed in Time.

Washington, June 28.—(AP)—Driving hard to clear a legislative jam before the fiscal year ends, both Houses of Congress held unusual Saturday sessions today and the leaders reported that all key measures would be dispatched to President Roosevelt before the new fiscal period begins at midnight Monday.

The Senate, working under an agreement to vote by 1 p. m., was expected to give a substantial majority to a bill continuing for two years from July 1 the President's emergency powers to devalue the dollar amounting to \$2,000,000,000, and to approve the \$2,000,000,000 stabilization fund. Before a final vote could be taken, the chamber had to dispose of an amendment by Senator Adams (D., Cal.), proposing elimination of the stabilization power.

The originally scheduled session yesterday gave prompt approval to the biggest single appropriation bill in history—the \$10,384,821,624 Army Supply Bill. And before the day was over, a joint Senate-House Conference Committee met and agreed on the Senate total, which included \$500,000,000 for the construction of 15 new munitions plants.

Eighty-minute considerations of the measure was devoted mostly to the drafting of committee amendments by Senate clerks. Occasionally, however, Senator McNary (R., Ore.), the minority leader, obtained acceptance of minor changes from the bills managers. There was no question regarding the total amount of the measure.

The Senate also gave quick approval to the \$24,795,000 annual appropriation bill for the District of Columbia, and sent to the White House a measure extending the life of the Federal Housing Administration for two years and increasing from \$4,000,000 to \$5,000,000 the amount of mortgage insurance it may have outstanding. Because House assistance, a previously approved Senate rider extending mortgage

Picnic Poison Cause Sought

300 Stricken in Throng Of 5,000 at Pennsylvania Masonic Outing.

Williamsport, Pa., June 28.—(AP)—Perplexed authorities today sought the cause of a mysterious ailment which suddenly struck down 300 men and women as it swept through a throng of 5,000 adults at the height of a picnic outing.

Commander-in-chief George Lamade of the Williamsport Masonic Consistory which sponsored the fête said some medical attendants attributed the wave of illness to food poisoning. Detective Chief Joseph M. Schumacker, however, declared this uncertain and ordered an analysis of food, ice cream and drinks served.

The picnicers were gathered over the lawn of former State Senator Charles W. Snow's nearby 200-acre estate when stricken yesterday during the principal address of the occasion. The program halted immediately and the gala scene within a matter of minutes turned into what resembled an emergency hospital.

Doctors and nurses among the crowd volunteered to attend the sick which overwhelmed the three-story Stone mansion. Many men sought refuge from 85-degree heat in nearby woods where they had found ambulances in the area.

Subway Row May Affect Other Jobs

New Yorkers Wondering About Way to Get To Work If Strike Is Called Next Tuesday.

Millions of New Yorkers, counting less numbers of them directly associated with national defense activities, wondered today whether they would have trouble getting to and from their jobs next week in view of the projected subway strike.

Their mayor, Fiorello H. La Guardia, has said the city will not recognize as "legitimate" the proposed walkout of some 22,000 transit workers in the city-owned subway, set for July 1.

But the CIO's Transport Workers union went ahead with a strike today, a second group of employees willing to back up demands for higher wages. The union asks a dollar a day more for all workers. Car cleaners now get \$24.50; car mechanics \$41 to \$44.44; truckmen \$35.50 to \$40.89.

William Guggenheim Succumbs After Illness Of Several Weeks.

Although he retired from family firm 40 years ago to devote himself to philanthropic and patriotic enterprises, and wrote many booklets with patriotic themes, Guggenheim remained best known as one of America's copper kings.

Bern*to Celebrate 750th Anniversary Despite War

Bern, Switzerland, June 28.—(AP)—This city of peace, nestled in the mountain country of a country that has been at war, will ring tonight to the music of a thousand accordions and the singing of the chorale of the Swiss people's most famous soldiers.

There'll be a parade today under the blowing flower boxes which the House of Zähringen in its glory in nearly 750 years ago, because Bern was the last of a line of fortifications along the Aare river, while fierce fighting continued in the valley.

Back in 1130 on a hump of land, standing where the Aare made a bend, stood a little castle called Burg Hydok, which was protected by a deep river bank. Berthold of Zähringen ordered King Von Bilsen to build a wall along a valley to close off the fourth side.

Tanks, Planes, Guns In Counter Assault; Report Still General

Larger Auto Output Curb In Prospect

Communicate Again Deliberately Refrains From Mentioning Any Specific Action on Far-Flung Russian Front; Not Single Town Taken or Named; Report of Capture of Minsk.

Berlin, June 28.—(AP)—Victories won by Adolf Hitler's columns in seven days of furious thrusts against Soviet armed forces will be made known tomorrow, just one week after the outbreak of the Russo-German war. The Fuehrer's field headquarters promised today. The headquarters communicate again deliberately refrained from mentioning any specific action on the far-flung Russian front, and named not a single town taken. Laconically it asserted: "Our big successes in the eastern theater of war will be made known in special announcements tomorrow."

Huge Bomber Passes Test

Maiden Flight Successful; Grooned for Series of Testing Hops.

March Field, Calif., June 28.—(AP)—The maiden flight completed, the Douglas B-24, described by the Army Air Corps as the world's biggest bomber, was grooned today for a long series of test hops which probably will determine whether the country will build a fleet of super-dreadnoughts of the air.

Such a fleet, based on the experimental work which went into the B-24, would be a more than a mere possibility. Responsible military opinion has held ever since the start of the European war that air power is the coming of age, larger, faster and more heavily armed battle-crafts inevitably will follow.

Maurice Gannett, former generalissimo of the Allied forces, had escaped from prison in France and that two persons are under arrest on suspicion of having aided his escape. Gannett had been confined since Sept. 16, 1940, by order of the government of Marshal Pétain, and held with Fernand Prévost, Daladier, Bergon and other French officials over their responsibility for the French declaration of war, and the collapse of France. The German radio said Gannett escaped at 11 a. m. Friday from the prison at Bessines and that his flight was announced by Vichy only this morning.
