A mechanical advance is the raysonde, an automatic apparatus attached to a small, rapidly-rising balloon that goes up to about 20, feet. It sends back by radio signals the upper air temperatures, pressures and humidities.

Even after years of experiment, there are only about 30 of these in daily use in the United States. They still rely on a human hair to give humidity changes. This makes them inaccurate, because a hair is too slow a reporter. Faster humidity detectors are becoming available.

Balloons watched through a theodolite give the speeds and directions of upper air currents on fair days only. A few planes still go up for forecasting data.

The commander of a well equipped Army might, if he had weather planes and other facilities, be able to forecast good flying attack weather. This would apply for only a few hours, but sufficient for speedy planes.

The administration at Washington has given its blessing to the enlistment program and President Roosevelt said he believed American mechanics could seem with

Applicants passing health and character requirements will be given technical examinations through the facilities of Radio Marine Corporation. They must agree to serve for a period of three years or for duration of the war, whichever is shorter.

Radio Marine acts merely as a clearing house, sending the papers to the British consulate here where the experts select qualified applicants.

Americans chosen for service will be given transportation to a Canadian port a few days before time for sailing. Most of them will go direct to Engiand, but others will serve in various parts of the British Empire.

They will receive free board and living quarters, a uniform, and a salary of \$21.11 a week during the first month of training. After that basic workers will receive \$24.12 and chief foremen \$38.65. Arrangements will be made for alloting portions of salary to dependents in the United States.
