There are two good reasons for preventing inflation, first that the tendency, under inflation, for that the tendency, under inflation, to make excessive private investment would increase the difficulty of guiding our capital into war time industries and, second, that financing the war by borrowing, whether borrowing by means of inflation or borrowing by means of inflation or borrowing by any other means, will encourage us to spend money for living as usual, competing with the government in the purchase of goods and in the employment of labor.

These are the diract dangers of inflation but the great danger is indirect. It is the danger that the Connecticut Economic Council and those of like mind may be successful in the presentation of their views and throw such a scare into the monetary authorities that, to avoid a comparatively harmless inflation, they will throw us into a disasterous depression. That was what happened in 1936-38 and now is no time to repeat that blunder.






