## Nazis Claim Swift Progress into Russia; Soviets Declare Fierce Drives Checked

### Governors Urged To Pare Budgets As Revenues Fall

**Defense - Necessitated Federal Expenditures Seen Cutting Sharply Into Incomes; Coordination of Taxes Also Is Advocated.**

Boston, July 2.—(AP)—Fear that scheduled increases in Federal taxes on liquor would result in revival of bootlegging was expressed today by Gov. James H. Price (D) of Virginia as state governors considered the possibility of seeking elimination of overlapping Federal-state taxes.

Boston, July 2.—(AP)—Gov. ernors of Rhode Island, Ohio and New Jersey expressed their belief today that defense-necessitated Federal expenditures would cut sharply into state revenues as they urged their fellow chief executives to pare their budgets and prepare for any emergencies arising after the war.

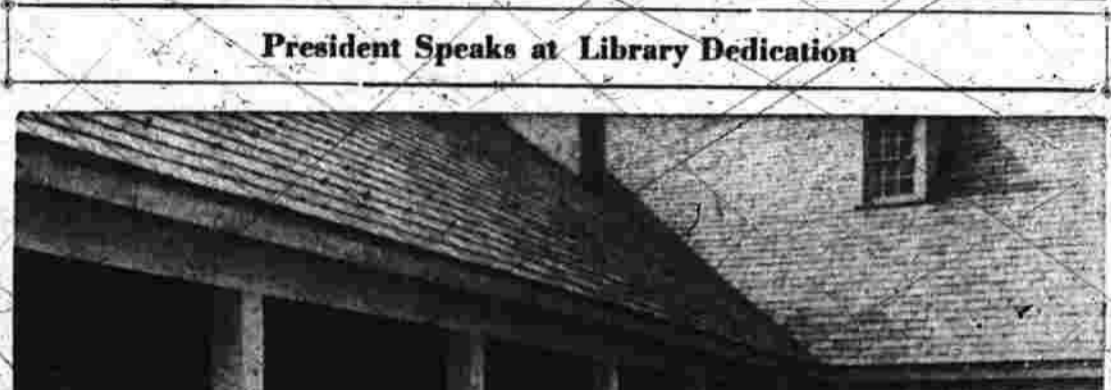
Gov. J. Howard McGrath (D, Rhode Island) suggested at the third annual Conference of State Governors that representatives of the state and Federal governments jointly draft a program for "coordinating and correlating state and Federal taxes to duplicate bases."

"It may be," he said, "that the state should surrender certain kinds of taxes to the Federal government and that the Federal government should retire from certain fields in favor of the states. . . . I believe that the time has come for both the state and Federal government to put their houses in order in this respect."

Recommended Economy  
All three—Governors McGrath, John W. Bricker (R, Ohio) and Charles Edison (D, New Jersey)—recommended economical operation of state government during the emergency, accumulation of reserves for use in the post war period, and postponement of non-essential state enterprises requiring great expenditures.

All three emphasized in prepared addresses, that there must be no curtailment of essential services of the states to their citizens.

### Radio Buoys Sub Rescue Device Base

**Army Ordnance Expert Also Offers New Type Steel Diving Chamber Holding Pure Oxygen.**

San Diego, Calif., July 2.—A new submarine rescue method employing radio buoys which automatically flash SOS signals and a new type of steel diving chamber has been devised at Fort Rosecrans by Master Sergeant Frank Newton, Army Ordnance expert and inventor.

Newton displayed a design for a steel diving chamber, 30 inches wide and eight feet long, containing 20 cubic feet of pure oxygen compressed at 2,000 pounds pressure, and lime in a separate perched container to absorb exhaled carbon dioxide.

Better Than Present Bell  
He said such a chamber "is improvement on the present diving bell because its two occupants could regulate oxygen pressure by valves to maintain surface atmospheric pressure at all times, thus enabling rapid ascent."

The present diving bell, he said, "is a steel chamber in which the air is replaced by pure oxygen."

### Capital Stock Levy Jumped For New Bill

**Committee Votes Tentative Increase as Measure Drafted \$4,400,000 Above Its Goal.**

Washington, July 2.—(AP)—The House Ways and Means Committee completed the preliminary drafting of a \$3,500,000,000 tax bill today—\$4,400,000 above its goal—after voting tentatively to increase the capital stock tax on corporations.

Representative Cooper (D, Tenn.), a member, announced that the committee had agreed today to raise the present rate of 1.10 per cent to 1.20 per cent. He said this was estimated to yield \$110,000,000.

The committee also voted to impose a 10 per cent manufacturer's excise tax on ordinary goods which would produce an estimated \$1,000,000,000 and to increase the present withholding tax on non-resident foreign aliens and non-resident foreign citizens.

### Wavell Transfer Seen Move to Meet Threat

**Britons Speculate on Possibility of Quick Nazi Drive on Russia and India.**

London, July 1.—(AP)—Gen. Sir Archibald Wavell suddenly was transferred today from the Middle East to India, and surprised Britons speculated on the possibility that the government foresaw a quick German victory over Soviet Russia and a subsequent Nazi drive on the Ganges. The transfer, in fact, was a switch of commands.

Gen. Sir Claude Auchinleck, 57-year-old Scot, moving from India to the Middle East.

Sir Claude, about whom the British public knows little, has served in Egypt, Aden, Iraq, Kurdistan and India. He was named commander-in-chief of India last Jan. 27 after distinguishing himself by directing the British attack on Narvik, Norway, and rescuing English coastal defenses.

Named Minister of State  
At the same time the appointment of Capt. Oliver Lyttelton as minister of state and a member of the war cabinet to represent the cabinet in the Middle East was announced.

Prime Minister Winston Churchill today refused to make a statement in the House of Commons which might explain the reason for the change. Denying a request for such a statement by Leslie Hore-Belisha, former war minister, Churchill said: "I do not see any advantage in adding to information already given at the present time."

### Japan Chooses Policy on War Of Nazis, Reds

**Matsuoka Tells Nation Grave State of Emergency Is Developing Throughout World.**

Tokyo, July 2.—(AP)—The government announced today it had chosen a policy for coping with the crisis arising from the Russian-German war and Foreign Minister Matsuoka today said the nation that "a really grave state of emergency is developing throughout the world, particularly in East Asia with direct concern to our country."

The nature of the government's decision, even its general trend, remained undisclosed despite statements issued by the cabinet and Matsuoka after a morning conference at the imperial palace in which generals and admirals of the high command met with key members of the cabinet in the presence of Emperor Hirohito.

### Beirut Bombs Bring Protest

**French Mandate Government Describes Attacks as "Terroristic"**

Beirut, Lebanon, July 2.—(AP)—The French mandate government today addressed a strong protest to the American government against what was described as "terroristic" British bombardments of Beirut.

The French high commissioner added his own protest to that of the local government, pointing out that the French had not bombed Beirut since either Syria or Palestine despite the fact that a number of British troops were garrisoned in Damascus and in Palestine towns. (The British have reported a raid on Damascus in which several civilians were killed, but British sources said the planes were German.)

Handed American Consul  
The Lebanon protest was handed to the American consul with a request that it be transmitted to Washington and eventually to London.

The British raids on Beirut since Sunday night were believed responsible for the protest.

The number of killed and wounded has not yet been announced, but it is known to have been heavy. Every quarter of the city has been attacked several times and last night four separate heavy raids occurred.

### State WPA Administrators Tackle Cut in Employment

**Chicago, July 2.—(AP)—State administrators of the Work Projects Administration today tackled a sharp WPA employment reduction job today.**

### Germans Assert Three More Destroyed by Action of Air Force

**British Bombers Destroyed Three German U-Boats**

Berlin, July 2.—(AP)—German submarines have sunk seven British merchant ships totaling 40,000 tons off West Africa and in the North Atlantic and the Luftwaffe has destroyed three more vessels totaling 11,000 tons in waters around England, the German high command announced today.

Its communiqué said one boat- U-boat was damaged by British bombers and another large vessel crippled by bombers in English waters.

It also reported that German and Italian planes had scored bomb hits on a British light cruiser and two destroyers off the North Atlantic coast while German Stukas yesterday destroyed two merchant vessels in the harbor of Brest.
