THOSE who lacked the patience to read Adolf Hitler's "Mein Kampf" all the way through, and sneaked a look at the back pages, found this passage: "We must never forget that the genesis of present-day Russia are common bloodstained criminals. Nor must we forget that these rulers belong to a nation which... believes itself called upon to impose its bloody oppression on the whole world."

For years Nazi Germany acted on that theory. Then, for a brief spell after Hitler's command against non-aggression treaty, the two nations were buddies. Now, with German armies driving into Russia for the second week, Nazi theorists have gone back to "Mein Kampf". The Germans are putting the war on a crusade basis and offering the world's "for-or-against-Communism choice. If you're against Communism, they argue, you must be for Germany."

"Common Danger" "Yesterday Hitler was fighting against states which vainly sacrificed themselves for England," said Dietrich von Haeften, a commentator for foreign correspondents. No Effective Air Support Given 'Reds'

Germany's drive to the east have been little, if any, effective support from the air. The German high command traveled by automobile along highways littered with hundreds of abandoned tanks, smashed Russian cannon, scores of Russian aircraft and a constant stream of refugees led behind by the Red Army.

During the past few weeks, the German air force has been unable to do much more than harass the Russian planes. It is estimated that only a few hundred German aircraft have been able to penetrate the Russian air defenses.

Thousands of Russian prisoners, many bare-footed, marched back along the roads we traveled in one vast camp in conquered territory. I saw about 4,000 Russian prisoners in one place, and another 50,000 prisoners. Many more than 50,000 could be cared for, German officers told me.

All southern Polish, German and Italian troops are being moved to the east. The German motor columns are moving to the east. The German air force is being used to harass the Russian planes.

Many of the prisoners said they were not given any food. They were given only a few pieces of bread and a little water. They were given no medical attention.

There also was a goodly number of professional Russian soldiers and high officers, including at least one general, who were taken to the rear.

The Russian and German troops in the fighting had been bitter. Yet, strangely, the Germans on the south front were not firing their rifles. They were only firing their machine guns.

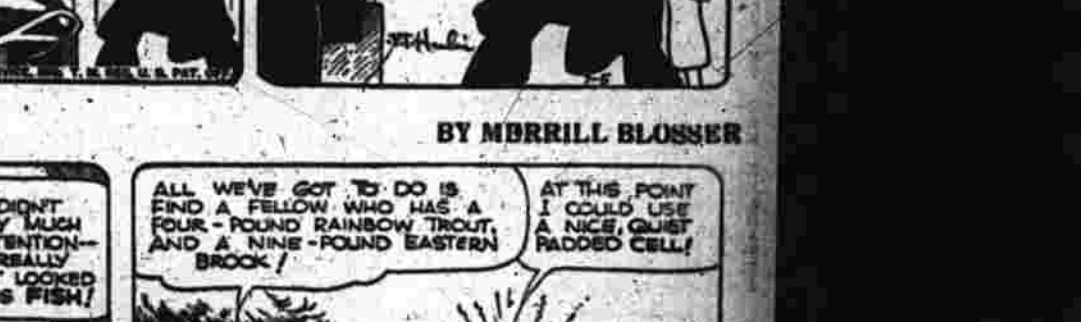

Heavy Traffic Over Holiday

Detoured Through Town Because of Conditions on Other Roads

Traffic was heavy through Manchester late Thursday afternoon and all day yesterday, despite the gloomy weather.

Starting at 4 o'clock Thursday afternoon traffic going east through the Center was so heavy that on several occasions cars were blocked from the Center back to New street, to get of Center street, and others left West Center at McKee and Cooper, and drove through Sumner, and Walnut streets while the cars that left the line at Pine street drove through the freight yard or across the bridge on Park street. New street traffic went through Garden street.

Due to tie-logging The extra amount of traffic was due to the signs directing traffic through the Silver Lane route into Manchester, Route 1 through East Hartford to South Windsor and through Wapping was under repair in so many places that the cars were routed through Silver Lane, Burnside avenue from Burnside to Station 22 being torn up, also resulted in the traffic that would have come through Woodland and through Buckland, being sent through Silver Lane.

West Bound Traffic In addition the west bound traffic was directed through Oakland street to North Main and south to the Center and then west through Center street and diverted through West Center street.

It was not until nearly 10 o'clock Thursday that the traffic was flowing freely. Yesterday signs were erected at the Center by the Motor Vehicle Commissioner directing traffic to follow the arrows and take the West Center street section at the intersection of West Center and Center streets, which was done to help the flow of traffic going west tomorrow, when like conditions are expected.

Adopting the slogan "Hold one job and do it well," State Headquarters says, "It is of the utmost importance that in setting up the active machinery of the Council, no one individual be assigned to do pieces of work which conflict or may conflict in case of an emergency. Obviously, one person already enrolled as an air raid warden, in the Aircraft Warning Service or some other technical post, cannot also be enrolled as a car driver whose services might be required at a moment when the Air Raid Warning Service, or the Air Raid Warden swings into action."

Ready Reference The necessity for duplicate records, one set at State Headquarters and one at the office of the Local Defense Council is pointed out in the statement furnished to the organization of uniform local Defense Councils, the first in a series of printed manuals has been received by Local Defense Councils from the State Defense Council Headquarters at Hartford.

The Manual, including a chart of important committees, suggests a tentative uniform plan which can be easily adapted to local conditions.

It is the intention of the State Defense Council, to make no recommendations to Local Defense Councils which have not been thoroughly thought out to stimulate duplication of effort so far as possible.

Colonel Samuel H. Fisher, State Defense Administrator said in announcing that the Manual had by this time been received by the Local Defense Councils.

Fourteen suggested sub-committees, each with a specific immediate task assigned, are recommended in the Manual. They include: fire affairs, finance, police affairs, air raid warden, emergency housing, emergency water supply, motor vehicles, civil defense, unit agriculture, survey and planning, promotion and education, volunteer registration, women's defense activities and aluminum scrap collection.

For Use of Cars The police department would operate within a net budget if repairs had always been covered to their credit, previous to two years ago, when they were the costs of the court the charges that was made for the use of the automobile were always figured. This was considered a part of the expense of the police department and each quarter when the money for the use of the car, or other unusual expense, were checked the money was turned over to the State Defense Administrator. In this way the costs of operating the police cars were reduced.

Court Gets Credit For the past two years this has not been done and the police department has been losing this credit. The town court has been getting it. It was never intended to have the court self supporting. The report shows that even with this credit given to the police court there will be a deficit in this budget.

Now that the police cars are equipped with a two way radio the cars are called upon to respond to many more calls at one time considered police work, but now looked upon as a necessary part of the police work. The police cars are operated 24 hours a day. The fact that the police commissioners are considering an increase of the pay of the police and may ask for an increase in the budget for the past year, is likely to cause some comment.
