Deutchland had been broken through a fortified Russian line only by possession of the important highway to the Soviet Arctic port of Murmansk. The German forces pushing ahead in the Baltic area had captured Parnu and Viikand, in southern Estonia, and Ostrov, south of Pator on the main rail route to Leningrad.

Russian forces in this area are in retreat and are being closely pursued after having been frustrated in an attempt to set up a new defense line on the border between Latvia and Russia proper.

As a consequence of defeating the German forces, the Soviet army has advanced across the frontier of the U. S. S. R. to seize Ostrov, a city not mentioned in the German report.
