Nor did she have any great desire to offer Russia much protection against the Nazi menace, since it was Russia that moved in and aggressively seized all three Baltic states shortly after World War II began.

The above stamp was issued in 1838, when Latvians were still enjoying peaceful lives. It is a view of Lioland, and was issued to commemorate the 20th anniversary of the Latvian republic.

Latvia, like her neighbors—Lithuania and Estonia—was set up independently after World War I. Like so many other small European nations, Latvia tried to maintain an attitude of neutrality toward World War II, but this policy was short-lived. Not long after the Nazis divided Poland with Russia, Joseph Stalin sent his troops into the Baltic states to take over as a "protective" measure.
