The aircraft factories alone are out-bidding each other for the supply of college-trained men.

Washington, July 10.—(P)—The government payroll increased by one-third in the first 12 months of full defense effort, the Civil Service Commission disclosed today in reperting a total of 1,306,333 civil employes in the executive break

Total May Increase 55,050

The total increase in the government payroll during May was 55,050. In addition to War and Navy, the major increases were:
Post Office Department, 2,421:
Agriculture, 1,771; Interior, 1,625, and TVA, 1,403. The Panama Canal roll declined by 283, but its total of 33,337 was 13,000 greater than a year ago.

The May payroll for the executive hyanch was \$198,352,359, an increase of 59,158,925 over April and of \$48,970,194 over May, 1946. In the District of Columbia, employment rose to 177,226, an increase of 4,520 for the month and of 48,390 for the year.

In the latter part of June, Director LaGuardia of the Office of Civilian Defense charged with the supervision of the aluminum collection, or "shower" as he termed it, requested each State Governor to supervise the organization of State, County and Municipal committees to conduct the campaign. Mayors of the larger cities were also directly requested to assume responsibility for organizing the drive in their municipalities.

It was assumed that the Governors would use existing State. County and local defense councils wherever possible, and would see that committees were set up where no defense councils existed. This procedure is being generally followed in New England, although there are variations to fit individual states and local needs and conditions.

In Massachusetts for example, a state chairman to conduct the aluminum drive, Lee Witney, manager of the Hotel Kenmore, has been appointed by J. W. Farley, Executive Director of the Massachusetts Committees on Public Safety, long since established by Governor Saltonstall, A strong state organization for the aluminum campaign has been perfected. FHA Active Entering

Eighth Year

The Federal Housing Administration is entering its eighth year of activity, with its program operating at high speed to meet the pressing need for housing accommodations for the Nation's growing army of defense industry workers.

Since June 27, 1934, when the National Housing Act, which created the FHA program, was approved by President Rooseveit, approximately 725,000 American families have purchased sound small homes through FHA-insured mortgages totaling \$3,100,000,000. During that same period more than 3,000,000 home properties have been improved or repaired through loans insured under the FHA's Title I program

The magnitude of this expansion is shown by the fact that during the past 12 months construction has been launched under FHA inspection on approximately 195,000 small homes. This is by far the largest volume of home construction under the FHA program in any 12-month period and represents a gain of more than 25 per cent over the preceding 12 months.

At least 85 per cent of those FHA-insured homes are located in regions where defense industries are active. Moreover, the typical moderate price of the small homes built under the FHA plan is well suited to the basic housing needs of defense localities.

per cent reduction in the nation's long-distance telephone charges went into effect today.

The rate reduction, negotiated after the Federal Communications Commission had ordered an investigation of Long-distance tolls, estimated at \$14,000,000 annually. Reductions generally apply 10 distance calls between 144 and 1, 330 miles. Report charges on incompleted calls are eliminated, and overtime rates for person-to-person calls are reduced to the overtime rates for station-to-station calls.


