Britain Has Just Begun Attacking Germany by Air

Churchill Asserts Nation Only at Beginning of Growing Power; Time to Make Germans Suffer in Own Homeland and Cities.

London, July 14.—(AP)—Britain, unshaken by ten months of German air blows, has begun hitting back with a heavy hand and still is only at the beginning of her growing air power, Prime Minister Churchill told thunderously cheering civil defense workers today. The prime minister delivered virtually the same fighting message twice—first to 6,000 clamoring veterans of the defense of London in a great review in Hyde Park and later to a luncheon of the capital's organized civil defenders.
