


The 400th anniversary of the founding of Santiago, Chile, was commemorated in 1941 by a series of stamps including the issue above showing Henriques seated with a newspaper in hand.

Spain invaded Chile in 1535. The Spanish found the Araucanians, chief Indian tribe, harder to subdue than the Incas. Spain did not gain control of the entire country until 1773.

Napoleon's invasion of Spain gave Chile its chance for independence. The Spanish governor was forced to resign in 1810. After eight years of struggle, in which Argentina aided the patriots, independence was proclaimed in 1815. Henriques, who was priest and author as well as journalist, was forced to flee to Argentina during
