Palmer Warns Army Needs Full Strength; Loan Is Given Britain

\$425,000,000 Lent to Help Pay for Supplies Ordered Before Enactment of Lend-Lease Program; Collateral Estimated at \$500,000,000 Given; To Mature in 15 Years.

Washington, July 22.—(P)—The Federal Loan Agency announced today a \$425,000,000 loan to Great Britain, against an estimated \$500,000,000 worth of collateral, to help the British pay for war supplies ordered in the United States prior to enactment of the lend-lease program. The loan was authorized by the Reconstruction Finance Corporation with the approval of President Roosevelt and at the request of Jesse Jones, Federal loan administrator, the agency said in a statement.

The deal was arranged, the statement explained, "for the purpose of providing the British with dollar exchange without having to sell their securities and investments at forced sale."

The loan agency's statement said the rate of approximately \$100,000 a month, under terms of the deal, and the loan bearing interest at 3 per cent annually will mature in 15 years. It may then be extended for five years provided two-thirds of the principal has been repaid.

Interest and dividends from the collateral securities to be pledged to the RFC, however, plus earnings assigned to it from United States branches of 41 British insurance companies, was described in the statement as adequate to amortize the entire loan by the end of the maturity period.

Authorized Under Law

The loan agency's statement said this new financial assistance to war-torn Britain was authorized under a law enacted last month which specified the RFC could make loans to a foreign government to get maximum dollar exchange for its property in this country.

When the lend-lease program was established, the British already had piled up huge orders for munitions.

Strong Raiding Force Roars Across Channel

British Fliers Continue Widespread Attacks on German-Held Territory During This Afternoon

London, July 22.—(P)—Strong R.A.F. units roared across the channel this afternoon in continuation of widespread raids of last night and this morning on German-held territory. Objectives in western Germany, Denmark, the Netherlands, Belgium and northern France were attacked overnight, the British said.

This afternoon's raid seemed concentrated on the coast between Calais and Boulogne, where anti-aircraft guns blazed into action. The French cliffs, dimly outlined through the haze. The rumble of explosions rattled doors and windows on the English coast, where watchers could see the bursting of anti-aircraft shells.

From the earliest raids only one British bomber failed to return, the Air Ministry said.

Shipbuilding yards at La Trinité in France were bombed in daylight operations today, authoritative sources said, and four German fighters were shot down in the 20,000,000 pounds in donations to the R.A.F.

New Method for Making Liquid Coal Is Reported

State College, Pa., July 22.—(P)—A new method of making liquid coal, by which coal is dissolved more completely than ever before, was reported today at Pennsylvania State College.

The new fluid, which 60 per cent of it is mixed with oil, makes a boiler fire burn hotter, coal or oil, or gas.

The process was discovered by Dr. William M. Fisher, professor of fuel technology. A U. S. patent has been assigned by him to the Pennsylvania Research Corporation, an affiliate of the college.
