Manufacture in southern California for air defense has brought about changes in production methods which are boosting the output of the individual workman. It has intensified research work, looking toward the time when—the manufacturers insist—the national emergency will have opened the door in more normal times to the carrying of freight by air.

They are preparing now for post-emergency fabrication of planes to supply air transportation to passengers at a fraction of the current cost.

Plants Ahead of Schedule

The planes are rolling out of the factory doors at a pace not even the most sanguine dared hope for when the first deluge of orders was received last October.

In the first six months of this year most of the plants had completed construction projects which had been acheduled for completion by next January. On Jan. 1, 1939, they had 2,500,000 square feet of space to work in. On June 1 of this year they had 10,650,000 square feet.

Buy on Installment Finn When the payrolls began to swell, the new workers began buying. They bought on the installment plan. That created what a legislative committee called a loan shark problem.

Pay envelopes were attached. In a body the aircraft companies went to Bacramento for relief for their men. Sharp restrictions were placed by law on the type of document which, signed by a worker, would be accepted as a basis for attaching his wages.

The workers had to have recreation. Free movies were provided on the plant grounds. Movie actors and actresses accepted as part of their job in national defense appearances before audiences of workmen.

Clubs were formed. Some workers are learning to fly. Others belong to mounted, uniformed horseback drill teams.

Under the Treaty of Versailles, Danzig became a free city, flew its own flag, made its own laws, maintained an army and isaued its own money and stamps. All that ended when Germany took over. that ended when Germany took over.

The city was founded by Germans at the beginning of the 13th century. Polish Pomeranian dukes ruled until 1308. The Teutonic knights assumed control and governed until 1454.

From 1454 to 1793 the city was associated in a personal union with the kings of Poland.

In 1807, Danzig became a free city for the first time under French sponsorship. With the collapse of the Napoteonic regime, Danzig returned to Prussia, thus remained until the Treaty of Versailles.




