# Nazis Again Shower Bombs on Moscow; Scores Killed, Hurt

### Russians Declare Raids Another Setback for Luftwaffe; Indicate Nazi Ground Forces Make No Progress Inside Finnish, Ukrainian Frontiers; Stubborn Battles Reported.

Moscow, July 23.—(AP)—A second successive night of Nazi aerial attacks on Moscow admittedly left scores killed and injured, but the Russians declared today the raids were not another setback for the Luftwaffe and indicated that German ground forces had made no progress inside the Finnish and Ukrainian frontiers. The Red Army's mid-day bulletin reported stubborn battles through the night, but it mentioned fighting in the same zones as yesterday and said nothing significant had occurred elsewhere.

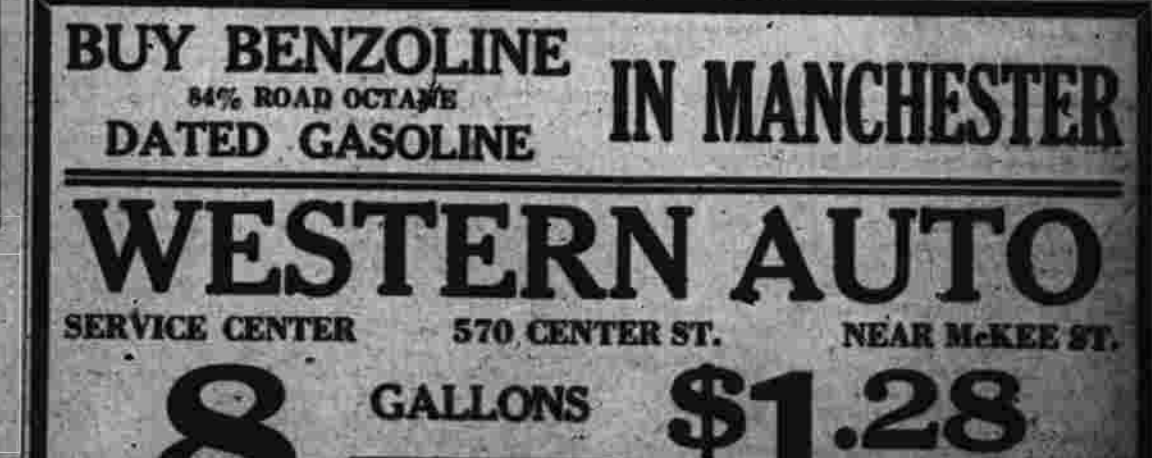
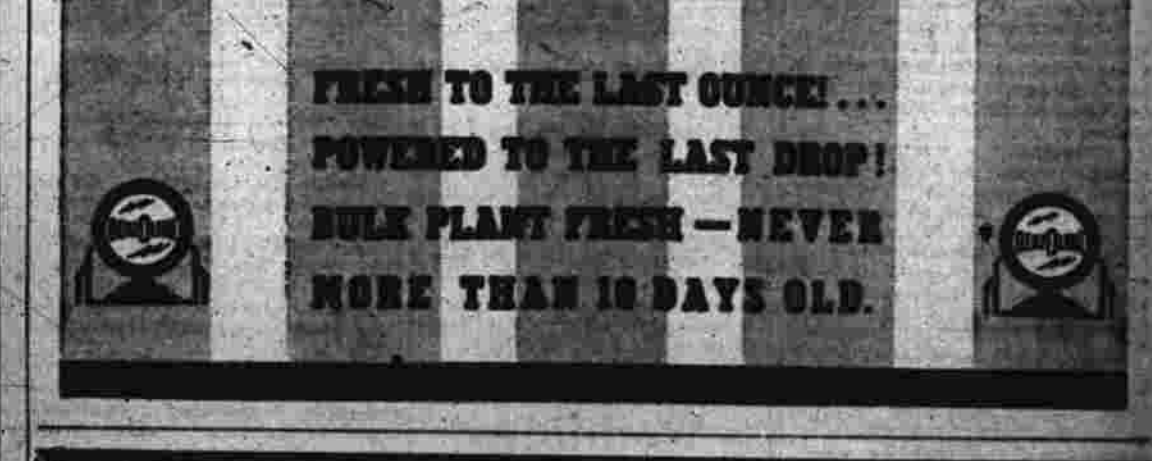
