Under quotas, a farmer may sell or feed only that grain produced on his acreage allotment. Any grain grown on acreage in excess of the allotment would be subject to a penalty, now set by law at half the government loan rate for wheat. This year the loan rates is 98 cents a bushel.



1,000 Homes a Day Going Up Under FHA

The Federal Housing Administration has released figures showing new home construction under the FHA program going forward at the rate of 1,000 homes a day.

During the week ended June 28 new homes started under FHA inspection reached a new peak at 5,687, far exceeding the former record of 5,044 established in the previous week and compared with 3,363 in the corresponding week a year ago. All but a small number of these homes are being built in defense industrial areas.

Recent action by the President in signing legislation passed by Congress amending Titles I and II of the National Housing Act assures that the complete services of the Federal Housing Administration will continue to be available to the public.






