Warships Off Camranh Bay, Cap St. Jacques; 12 Transports on Way To Saigon Following Vichy's Acceptance of Military Demands on French Colony; Bases Close to Singapore.

Saigon, French Indo-China, July 24.—(AP)—Japanese warships have arrived off two strategic points of French Indo-China—Camranh Bay and Cap St. Jacques—and 12 Japanese transports are en route to Saigon, well informed sources reported today following Vichy's acceptance of Tokyo's military demands on the French colony. Except for the formalities of details and signatures, Japan has won Naval and aerial positions in southern Indo-China two days by battleship and three hours by bomber from Britain's key fortress in the Far East, Singapore, at the tip of the Malay Peninsula.

The 12 transports were said to be en route from Hainan, Japanese-occupied Chinese island off the Indo-China coast which has been used for months as a troop concentration base.

Camranh Bay already is a naval base on Indo-China's southeast coast, 800 miles from Singapore, and Cap St. Jacques dominates the estuary of the Saigon river which ships must use to reach Saigon. This city has a modern air field, less than 700 miles from Singapore.

Marshall Rejects Plan For 16 Months' Duty

Asserts Taft's Proposal 'Has Great Merit, But Only For Long Range Peace-time Purposes'

Washington, July 24.—(AP)—Gen. George C. Marshall, Army chief of staff, turned thumbs down today on a proposal by Senator Taft (R., Ohio), to limit the maximum active service of Selected National Guardsmen and Reservists to 16 months. In a formal statement filed with the Senate Military Committee, General Marshall said that Taft's plan "has great merit, but only as a long range plan for peacetime purposes."

The present limit is 12 months but the Army wants to make the length of service indefinite. Taft's plan would require that the present limit be again to request that Congress remove, by joint resolution, the restrictive clauses in the present law affecting the Reserve components and Selected, in order that the Department may meet any situation which may arise. Windows on Two Sides of Residence of American Ambassador Blown In by Bomb During Third Night of Air Assaults; Two German Planes Snagged in Balloon Barrage Cables

Moscow, July 24.—(AP)—Windows on two sides of the residence of American Ambassador Laurence A. Steinhardt were blown in by a bomb during the third successive night of German air assault on Moscow last night. The raid, carried out in the city, again lasted five and one-half hours, but Russian planes, again last night, did not venture further eastward from this country, and according to British "future policy" declared today that it, like its predecessor, was a failure. No officers of the United States embassy were in the ambassador's residence, Spasskaya House. Four American newspapermen who were there at the time were unhurt.

Franco Seen Not Desiring Britain's Aid

Eden Says Future Policy Will Depend on Attitude of Spanish Government

London, July 24.—Foreign Secretary Anthony Eden told the Commons today that Generalissimo Franco's speech of July 17 "makes it appear that he does not desire further economic assistance from this country" and accordingly British "future policy" will depend on the attitude and attitude of the Spanish government.

In that speech the Spanish ruler reaffirmed his loyalty to the Axis and said that he would not be bound by the terms of the Munich agreement, but DNB, the official German news agency, reported the defeat of a large, trapped Red Army force at Nevel, north of Vitebsk, with "extraordinarily heavy losses." Italy Claims Full Triumph In Sea Fight

Asserts British Destroyer, Two Munitions Vessels and Another Ship Sunk During Battle

Rome, July 24.—(AP)—A fierce six-hour naval battle in the central Mediterranean, lasting from dawn till dusk yesterday, has ended in an Italian victory with a British destroyer, two munitions-laden steamers and another "large unclassified" ship, the Italian command declared today.

A big British convoy, escorted by battleships, cruisers, torpedo boats and destroyers, was spotted by Italian aerial scouts, and attacked by air and surface forces. The Italian fleet took up the fight. (British Naval sources in London made no comment on the Italian report.)
