

# America Will Act Tomorrow on Japan; Soviets Wipe Out Whole Nazi Division

## Officers and Men Reported in Favor Of Longer Service

Commander of 29th Division Gives Testimony Before House Military Committee; National Emergency Is Seen Best Solution.

**Bulletin!**  
Washington, July 25.—(AP)—Members of the Senate Military Committee were reported today to have agreed informally on the general terms of a resolution by which Congress would declare a limited emergency under which Selected National Guardsmen and Reserves could be retained in active Army service beyond the present one-year limit. Senator Lee (D., Okla.), told reporters when he came out of a closed session that a "count of noses" within the committee had disclosed no opposition to a proposal under which Congress would be asked to find that the national interests were imperiled.

Washington, July 25.—(AP)—Maj. Gen. Milton A. Rockord, commander of the 29th Division, testified today that 90 per cent of the men and all officers in his division were in favor of extended military service "if the need exists."

Rockord said he believed the nation was in grave peril and asserted he thought the way to solve the problem was for Congress to declare a national emergency and give the president the right to retain Selected and National Guardsmen beyond the one-year limit. "Don't tie the hands of the War Department in this situation," he urged, "advocating also that people stop writing foolish letters" on the subject.

Asked whether he knew of any "high officials" circulating the men in his division to oppose retention of service, Rockord said he knew only what he had read about the matter. At that point, he said he thought it was "an absurd proposition."

The Los Angeles strike, called by the AFL International Ladies Garment Workers' Union in support of demands for wage increases, affected about 3,000 workers, the majority of whom were sewing machine operators. The employer demanded increases ranging from 15 to 25 per cent in the case of the sewing machine operators, the increase sought.

## Freezing of Credits Most Likely Action; Japs Resent Stand

Evidence of Official and Popular Resentment of Attitude Increases as Papers Give Prominence to Roosevelt Statement; Government Studies Remarks On Why Oil Allowed.

Hyde Park, N. Y., July 25.—(AP)—President Roosevelt disclosed today that the United States would retaliate with specific action tomorrow against Japan's occupation of Naval and air bases in French Indo-China. He told a press conference there would be something out of Washington tomorrow, but would not say exactly what. But to members of the presidential party spending the week-end here the most likely move appeared to be the freezing of Japanese credits and assets in the United States.

More Americans, indeed, considered that step inevitable. But whether the United States was ready to take additional measures depended, depending on how the international situation develops in the Pacific.
