Reds Spread Attack To All Major Areas; Drives Trap Soviets

Bessarabia 'Completely Liberated' from Russians; Trapped Units in Smolensk Sector And Estonia Facing Destruction; Great Number of Prisoners, Booty To Be Reported Soon.

Berlin, July 29.—(AP)—Bessarabia has been "completely liberated" from the Russians and the last of the Red Army units trapped by German drives in the Smolensk sector and in Estonia are facing destruction, the high command declared today. "A great number of prisoners and a large amount of booty will be reported within a few days as a result of this tremendous battle of destruction," it said of the Smolensk fighting.

The high command, in a communique from the Fuehrer's headquarters, said that "the enemy's power groups which were overrun in the course of the Russian offensive have been virtually wiped out."

Face Destruction
"The last encirclement eastward of Smolensk is facing destruction," it said.

Modified Trench Warfare
West of Lake Peipus, the communique said, Russian forces "encircled by units assigned to mop-up operations of Estonia also are facing destruction."

German-Allied Rumanian troops completed the conquest of Bessarabia by reaching the Dniester river estuary, and operations in the neighboring Ukraine "continue steadily," the communique added.

Authorized sources declared that Gen. Ion Antonescu's Rumanian troops had captured Cernavoda, Bolzhan and Nistrup, and the Dniester mouth at the Black Sea and described this as the last Bessarabian town in Russian hands.

The Russian Black Sea port of Odessa, a city of 450,000, with both rail and highway connections to other key points of the Ukraine, Dniester estuary and about 20 miles northeast of Odessa (Alba).
