

Authority to Set Limit on Prices And Rents Asked

Roosevelt Asks Inflation-Fighting Authority

Washington, July 30.—(AP)—President Roosevelt, asserting inflationary price increases were threatening to "undermine our defense effort," asked Congress today to authorize him to establish ceilings for prices and rents.

"We face inflation, unless we act decisively and without delay," he said.

The president also requested a special message authority to purchase materials and commodities when necessary to assure price stability and to "meet more extensively with excess in the field of installment credit."

Expects Labor Cooperation

While refraining from seeking authority to put a limit on wages, he said he expected the voluntary cooperation of labor to prevent price costs from rising abnormally.

"Labor," Mr. Roosevelt said, "has far more to gain from price stability than from abnormal wage increases. For these are likely to be illusory, and quickly overtaken by sharp rises in living costs which will with particular hardship on the least fortunate of our workers and our old people."

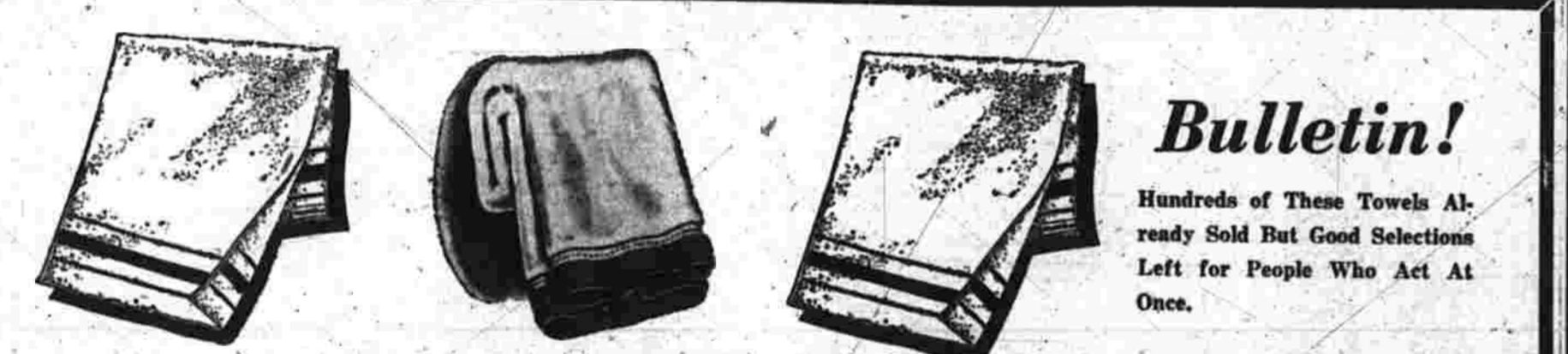
